A message from Father Vieira.....

More than skin deep

“Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law and the prophets; I have come not to abolish them but to fulfil them.” Matt 5:17 NRSV-CE
The Beatitudes must have seemed to invert the Law of Moses – a move that would be unthinkable to those who were listening to Him. However, it was not the Law of Moses that was being turned inside out. It was the additions and legalistic modifications applied by the religious rulers of the day that Jesus was condemning. It was their approach to keeping the law that had become no more than skin deep. Our adherence to the Law of God must come from the heart, indeed, from our very soul!

Jesus asks us to keep the true Law for the love of God and our neighbor. We are instructed not to count the cost, instead we are called to keep no count of wrongs, to forgive not once or seven times, but seventy times seven. We are called to remember that sin plants its seed in the heart and brings spiritual death to those who entertain such thoughts. I remember a birthday greeting card with a cartoon man on the front with a toothless grin, and the statement, “there isn't any harm in looking”. The truth is there is a profound harm in looking if it causes the person to sin. There are no private sins. Many who believe that no one is harmed by their actions are the most deceived. Like a stone on the surface of a pond, the ripples of one's actions can reach around the world.

So how are we to live? Jesus tells us that our righteousness must exceed that of the Scribes and Pharisees in order to enter the Kingdom of Heaven. The only way to do this is to allow the Spirit of God to so fill our hearts and minds that we love, we forgive, and we obey the Law of God from a heart that is one with Him. We keep His Law through choosing to place God first in all that we are, in all that we do; by uniting our will to His. Let us begin each day by offering ourselves to His service. In so doing we will know, love, and serve Him throughout the day, and make our Christian lives more than skin deep.
