Thank you for sharing in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with us today. Please introduce yourself after Mass.

If you are a Catholic, we at Holy Nativity receive Holy Communion kneeling and by intinction (both species on the tongue).

<u>If you are not a Catholic</u>, during Communion we invite you either to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest, or fingers across your lips, and receive a blessing from the Priest or Deacon, or remain in your pew and reflect on the presence of Christ.

"If You will, You can make me clean."

With these words of faith, a man suffering with leprosy cast himself upon the mercy of the Lord and begged for healing. He did not offer money or other items; he came with nothing but faith. He was willing to commit himself to God's will, "If You will..." in saying this he acknowledged the divine initiative of our Lord either to heal, or not to heal. Yet he knew deep in his soul that our Lord would answer his prayer. He not only healed the man but touched him physically in the process. In the time of our Lord's sojourn on earth such a move was unthinkable. Imagine the love and compassion of our Lord that must have swept over this man who had undoubtedly yearned for a human touch for who knows how long. Now fully healed our Lord sent him to obey the law of Moses by showing himself to a priest, to offer sacrifice to God, and to keep it quiet. That last part proved too much, he told everyone! However, our Lord surely knew this would happen, yet by admonishing the man to silence our Lord demonstrated that what He did was for the sake of those who were in need, not simply to gain the praise of men.

Over the life of the Church, we have come to see the disease of leprosy as an image of what sin does to the soul. Mortal sin separates us from God and must be removed by the sacrament of confession to restore the penitent to eternal life. This is a free gift that awaits us in the Sacrament of Confession. St. Peter tells us that the Lord "is forbearing toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance." 2 Peter 3:9b RSV-CE. We are also told, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just, and will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness." 1 John 1:9 RSV-CE

However, it is also important to confess Venial sins as well. They are like the bed bugs you pick up in the hotel. They won't kill you outright but will make life miserable until they are gone. They can lead to serious illness if untreated. The great saints made a habit of frequent confession not due to mortal sins, but to keep the venial sins at bay. While most parishes offer penance services at Advent and Lent that should be seen as the court of last resort. I strongly encourage much more frequent confessions for all the faithful. If you want to be healed (of your sins), you must ask in faith, and He will heal you.
