Thank you for sharing in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with us today. Please introduce yourself after Mass.

If you are a Catholic, we at Holy Nativity receive Holy Communion kneeling and by intinction (both species on the tongue).

<u>If you are not a Catholic</u>, during Communion we invite you either to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest, or fingers across your lips, and receive a blessing from the Priest or Deacon, or remain in your pew and reflect on the presence of Christ.

The Most Sacred Body and Blood of Christ

The readings for this Sunday begin with the establishment of the Passover meal, and end with the Gospel description of the Last Supper. Both of these contain the language of covenant. A covenant sealed in the Blood of the Lamb. In the first Passover the blood of the Lamb protected the Israelites from the angel of death. In the Last Passover the people of God are saved from eternal death. The sacrifice of our Lord upon the cross provided all who believe in Him to be saved from their sins and to be fed with eternal food.

The new covenant is sealed in the Body and Blood of Christ, which we receive in the sacrament of the Eucharist. This is not just remembered each Sunday at the Mass it is found in an unbloody representation of the sacrifice of our Lord upon the cross. When the priest, in persona Christi, pronounces the words of institution over the elements of bread and wine, they become truly the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ. This is explained in John 6 when our Lord specifically said we must eat His Body and drink His Blood. When challenged He did not downplay this part, He actually emphasized this point by stating we must do so or have no life in us, using language that is even more specific to eating.

Since it is clear that what happens at Mass is of such eternal importance, it becomes completely reasonable that we must treat the Eucharist with all the reverence and awe that being in the presence of God demands. This explains why Catholics need to take the reception of the Eucharist with such care. God Himself comes to us each Mass and feeds us with His Body and Blood. Do we stop to consider the tremendous gift we have received? This is a matter of great awe and great praise; it is a matter of worship that extends from the moment of receiving the Eucharist to the close of Mass and beyond. A prayerful recital of the Anima Christi would be very appropriate to say in the pew after receiving. Properly the Eucharist should be received on the tongue to prevent any particles from being lost, they are the body of Christ. It is through the practice of great care that we demonstrate our belief in the Real Presence and reinforce that belief in the hearts of those around us.

If what I describe sounds like possible overkill, remember this, we are given the greatest gift of all eternity each time we receive the Eucharist. Let us take utmost care to give thanks and show our love for God.
