Welcome to Our Visitors

Thank you for sharing in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with us today. Please introduce yourself after Mass.

If you are a Catholic, we at Holy Nativity receive Holy Communion kneeling and by intinction (both species on the tongue).

If you are not a Catholic, during Communion we invite you either to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest, or fingers across your lips, and receive a blessing from the Priest or Deacon, or remain in your pew and reflect on the presence of Christ.

Thy Kingdom Come, Thy Will Be Done

How often we pray these words in the Lord's Prayer, but do we truly consider the implications of what we have just said. We want God's presence in our lives, and we want to be like some of the great saints. Personally St. Francis, St. John of the Cross, and St. Padre Pio all loom large in my spiritual hero list. I can also say that I have yet to bi-locate or read the soul of a penitent. Such spirituality is the result of special graces and a total surrender to our Lord's will.

The first reading for today, from the prophet Ezekiel, describes God taking a tender shoot from the very top of a tree and planting it where it could thrive, produce fruit, and grow to invite all the world into its shelter. In the Gospel, the Lord describes the growth of the seed scattered by the farmer. A seed that grows according to the way it was created. The farmer enjoys the harvest but knows that it was indeed a miracle of Heaven that a harvest was enjoyed. So it is with the spiritual life. The farmer cannot cause the seeds to grow any faster by sheer force of will; rather, the farmer must abide by the plan of God. Fr. Bartunek, in his book, *The Better Part*, enumerates the following characteristics of spiritual growth. First, spiritual growth comes from God and not ourselves. Second, growth in holiness is a gradual process. Lastly, it takes time.

Looking at the end of the Gospel reading we find that our Lord spoke to the crowds only in parables but explained everything to the disciples, those He had called personally. It is spending that quiet and recollected time in the presence of the Lord that gives us some of the most profound insights. If our only encounters with the Lord are those in Mass on Sundays, we doom ourselves to a very shallow faith that is not fruitful. The faith must be lived daily, hourly, and moment by moment.

When we are tempted to give up on the spiritual life, when we do not find our lives transformed in the first days of our effort, we forget the second rule of spiritual development—it is gradual. We would be like the plant in another parable that sprang up quickly because it had a shallow root, but quickly wilted because it was not yet ready to deal with its environment.

Closely related to the principle of gradual growth is the fact of time. Experience often carries the day when faced with youthful exuberance. Experience only comes with time. Our spiritual growth, when carefully nurtured with daily prayer and meditation, will bear its greatest fruit only when the Lord determines that we have "ripened". For some this seems to take longer than for others. May the Lord grant us the grace to be drawn to Him, to patiently wait at His feet for Him to speak, and to trust that in His good time we will be the saints He has called each to be.
