Thank you for sharing in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with us today. Please introduce yourself after Mass.

If you are a Catholic, we at Holy Nativity receive Holy Communion kneeling and by intinction (both species on the tongue).

<u>If you are not a Catholic</u>, during Communion we invite you either to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest, or fingers across your lips, and receive a blessing from the Priest or Deacon, or remain in your pew and reflect on the presence of Christ.

Jesus I trust in You,

In the Gospel lesson two people need His attention. The first is Jairus whose daughter is gravely ill. The second is a woman who had been suffering from a hemorrhage for the last twelve years. Both had to be able to trust in the Lord's compassion. Jairus had to first find our Lord, and then to humble himself by pleading for the life of his daughter. One obstacle that stands between us and God is pride. Pride makes us want to go it alone, a fatal mistake both spiritually and physically. For this reason, St. Peter instructs us to "Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that in due time He may exalt you." 1 Peter 5:6. We give our care, and our destiny to God Who cares for us more than we can imagine.

Part of the care our Lord gives us is to sometimes stretch us beyond our comfort levels in order to bring spiritual growth in our souls. As our Lord begins the journey to Jairus' home a woman stretched out her hand and swept the hem of His cloak. She had been suffering for twelve years, the Apostle Luke tells us she had spent all her money seeking a cure to no avail. Her faith was such that she did not feel the need to ask, only to trust. Our Lord knew she needed to witness to her cure and that it would also be necessary for Jairus. One has to feel for Jairus. He is desperate to bring help to his daughter before it is too late, and now our Lord is taking the time to search for the person who touched Him, and to have a conversation with her. Jairus was learning patience. We often want the Lord to answer our prayers as soon as we ask, yet if we always received immediate answers, we would not learn to trust. We also would not have the chance to lean on the Lord and wait upon Him.

May the Lord grant us the humility to say, Jesus, I trust in You.
