Welcome to Our Visitors

Thank you for sharing in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with us today. Please introduce yourself after Mass.

<u>If you are a Catholic</u>, we at Holy Nativity receive Holy Communion kneeling and by intinction (both species on the tongue).

<u>If you are not a Catholic</u>, during Communion we invite you either to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest, or fingers across your lips, and receive a blessing from the Priest or Deacon, or remain in your pew and reflect on the presence of Christ.

"He charged them to take nothing for their journey except a staff, no bread, no bag, no money in their belts..."

Our Lord called the Twelve Disciples to Him and commissioned them to go into the surrounding areas to prepare them for His coming. He wants us to be involved in spreading the good news of the Kingdom of Heaven. The Disciples were not skilled preachers or well-trained rabbis, they were fishermen and others who loved the Lord. They were sent out to spread the good news, but what message were they to bring? They told of their personal encounter with the Lord. We also bear the same message. We do not always need a complicated explanation. Often a simple telling of our faith journey is the most powerful.

Who among us would be willing to go on a journey of multiple days, and depend solely on the goodness of those we met, and of the one Who sends us? The Disciples were sent to spread the Gospel and not to take extra clothing, money, or food. This must have been the ultimate test of faith. We can learn a powerful lesson from what our Lord asked of His disciples. The first few miles down the road they must have played through all manner of possibilities in their minds. Yet each step away from their comfort zone must have increased their trust as they were forced to step out in faith. Each possible need had to be answered by the words, "Master, I trust in You." We know it as "Jesus, I trust in You."

As we step out in faith to follow our Lord, we often want to hold to the security of our own abilities and resources. We cling to the past and fear the future. Yet each step in our lives must be a reminder of He in Whom we place our trust. God has given us many comforts and many consolations, if these are stripped away, we can remind ourselves of the Disciples, stepping down the road in faith. They trusted in the provision of God, let us also trust in Him.
