#### Welcome to Our Visitors

Thank you for sharing in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with us today. Please introduce yourself after Mass.

<u>If you are a Catholic</u>, we at Holy Nativity receive Holy Communion kneeling and by intinction (both species on the tongue).

<u>If you are not a Catholic</u>, during Communion we invite you either to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest, or fingers across your lips, and receive a blessing from the Priest or Deacon, or remain in your pew and reflect on the presence of Christ.

Have you ever experienced a time when you felt you were not up to the task ahead? Perhaps you were a new parent staring into the eyes of a child wondering desperately if you are capable of caring for this new life you have brought into the world. Maybe it was a person looking to you for answers you knew you did not have. Philip knew such a feeling in today's Gospel. Our Lord presented him with a problem, the people were hungry and needed to be fed and our Lord was looking at him asking for a plan. Parenthetically we are told that Jesus already had a plan but wanted to see Philip's reaction. Philip most likely surveyed the crowd, did some quick mental math, and fingering a few small coins in his bag immediately knew it was beyond him.

Philip knew the truth and acknowledged that there was no way they could buy the food. They had no choice but to entrust themselves to our Lord's plan. Often in this world we also size up our resources and realize we are unable to meet the challenge on our own. This is when we also must look to our Lord for answers, for strength, yes, for a miracle.

The first step in seeing the miracle is to offer what you have to the Lord. All He requires is for us to have a heart willing to trust and obey. Andrew trustingly brought the resources of five barley loaves and two small fish to the Lord. After the meal was blessed, the disciples obediently began to distribute the food, and watched in wonder as five thousand people ate their fill and were satisfied.

Today we learn from the miracle of the feeding of the five thousand that no matter what challenge we face we may not have the answers, or the strength, to meet the challenge, but God does. We learn to entrust ourselves to God's providence and thank Him in advance for His plan. We step out in obedience, trusting He will provide all we need.
