Thank you for sharing in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with us today. Please introduce yourself after Mass.

<u>If you are a Catholic</u>, we at Holy Nativity receive Holy Communion kneeling and by intinction (both species on the tongue).

<u>If you are not a Catholic</u>, during Communion we invite you either to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest, or fingers across your lips, and receive a blessing from the Priest or Deacon, or remain in your pew and reflect on the presence of Christ.

Be doers of the Word, and not hearers only

In today's Gospel lesson the Scribes and Pharisees decided to call our Lord to task for not forcing His disciples to obey the rules of the elders by washing their hands. We recently had an intense interest in hand washing with the now passed pandemic. While it is important to be sanitary an undue fascination with washing can become a detraction. The law of Moses insisted that the people cleanse themselves to separate themselves from the society of the Gentiles. This did not mean that people of other nations were physically dirty. It was a physical reminder to the people of Israel that they were to set themselves apart, to not participate in the religious practices of the other nations. So, every time faithful Israelites washed it was to remind them, they were called to serve God with all their heart, soul, mind, and body. The intent was that the people of God would be drawn ever deeper into the sacred mysteries and an ever-deeper relationship with God. However, this is very hard for most people and virtually impossible to measure, so over time they gravitated to the simpler to accomplish physical actions rather than the more difficult spiritual life.

We are called by the Apostle James to "...be doers of the Word, and not hearers only." Pope St. John Paul II spoke about practical atheism. Practical atheism acknowledges God exits but lives as though He didn't. In a sense, we become hearers of the word only. To be doers of the word is to live as though we truly believed Jesus died for us, loves us, and wants a relationship and communion with us. It is to accomplish what God desires of us—to be who He desires us to be. The only way to accomplish what God desires of us is to have our lives focused on doing His will with hearts that are filled with love for God, and for those around us. May our Lord grant us the grace to love Him with all our hearts, souls, minds, and bodies and to allow the Love of God to guard our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus our Lord.
