In the way of perfection

In 1583 St. Theresa of Avila published "In the Way of Perfection" a book dedicated to instructing people in the life of prayer and reform that was the Discalced Carmelite Order. Her order was the response to what the Order of Carmelites had become in her day. There was a distinct lack of spiritual depth in the order at that time, St. Theresa of Avila sought to regain that through rigorous asceticism, which included sandals, not shoes, hence the name Discalced.

The religious leaders of our Lord's day had also lost their understanding of the depth of the spiritual life as evidenced by their denigration of marriage, making it incredibly easy for a man to divorce his wife for frivolous reasons. They had come to view a woman as an expendable commodity, perverting the infinite dignity of the person and of marriage intended by God. Given that a woman in our Lord's day was much more dependent on her husband for stability and support this was literally tearing at the fabric of their society and their faith. They had lost the understanding of what marriage was intended to be in the plan of God from the beginning. We are told by the Church that the family is the cornerstone of society. If a husband and wife are uncommitted to stability it is like placing a sponge instead of a stone in the corner of the building. It will collapse.

This perfection and permanence in God's plan for marriage seems an impossibility, we are all broken by sin and tend to imperfection. This is true in all areas of our lives. How fitting that now our Lord turned His attention to children that were brought to Him for a blessing. He commanded them to allow the children to come to Him. He went on to say that we all must seek the Kingdom of God as little children, with faith and trust. From this we learn that it is not in our own strength that we achieve His will, but through the virtue of Faith.

Perfection in society, in the Church, in our families requires enormous effort. It begins with each of us. Our Lord said that He came that all may have life and have it abundantly. Jesus loves each one of us and wants us to have a life that has spiritual depth. He wants us to have a life of hope, meaning, peace and joy through a relationship with Him. This way of perfection is achieved through prayer, union with God, and daily sacrifice. May the Lord grant that we all achieve this perfection.
