Christ the King

When you hear of a king, what picture comes to mind? One might envision noble King Arthur or King Richard the Lion Hearted or perhaps the cruel and cowardly Prince John or even someone like Nero. All these are but pale comparisons to the King of kings. He alone is worthy of praise and as we close the liturgical year we are reminded once more of the awesome majesty of our God.

In the book of Daniel, the seventh chapter, our Lord is seen coming in the clouds of Heaven. There is none higher than God, and the image of His return is echoed in the Gospels when He speaks of coming in Glory at the close of the Age. The beauty of liturgy in the Catholic Church is that it elevates the mind and heart of those at Mass to contemplate the mysteries of Heaven. We do not come to Mass to worship our unity, nature, or any created thing. We come to worship God in all His glory.

In the Psalm appointed for today, Psalm 93, the throne of God is acknowledged to be without beginning or end. A quick review of history reveals that earthly royal dynasties arise, thrive, and die. The throne of Heaven will never have another seated upon it. We are secure in the knowledge that our God will never be overcome. The promises He has made will stand forever. This is confirmed in Revelation chapter one when our Lord identifies Himself as the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. He always was, and forever will be. We draw great comfort in knowing our faith has an everlasting foundation.

How did He choose to reveal His glory? As our Lord stood before Pilate covered in blood, an earthly ruler confronted the King of kings Who was about to perform the most kingly act of all, giving His life for His subjects. Pilate was a consummate politician who was willing to make all sorts of deals for the sake of his life. Our Lord willingly paid our debt by shedding His blood. Now, when we think of a King, let us envision our Lord upon the cross, leading us forward to the Kingdom of Heaven.
