Thank you for sharing in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with us today. Please introduce yourself after Mass.

<u>If you are a Catholic</u>, we at Holy Nativity receive Holy Communion kneeling and by intinction (both species on the tongue).

<u>If you are not a Catholic</u>, during Communion we invite you either to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest, or fingers across your lips, and receive a blessing from the Priest or Deacon, or remain in your pew and reflect on the presence of Christ.

At the Annunciation, Mary received and believed the message of the Archangel Gabriel. In response to her "fiat" or "yes" the new life that was conceived in her by the Holy Spirit was indeed the Word made flesh.
