Thank you for sharing in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with us today. Please introduce yourself after Mass.

If you are a Catholic, we at Holy Nativity receive Holy Communion kneeling and by intinction (both species on the tongue).

If you are not a Catholic, during Communion we invite you either to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest, or fingers across your lips, and receive a blessing from the Priest or Deacon, or remain in your pew and reflect on the presence of Christ.

He is Risen!! These words have thrilled the hearts of the faithful for nearly two thousand years. On the evening of Good Friday, our Lord laid dead in the tomb while His disciples hid behind locked doors. To Jesus' disciples it must have seemed that all was for naught. The Divine initiative to establish the Kingdom of Heaven was seemingly thwarted. Death was victorious, or so it appeared. Yet in the end death was swallowed in victory. He arose, taking with Him the souls of the faithful departed who awaited the joyful news of the Messiah. The Good Shepherd had laid down His life for His sheep and given them eternal life through the forgiveness of their sins. This is no hypothetical event. The reality is found in the lives of the saints whose were eternally transformed by walking with Him.
