Thank you for sharing in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with us today. Please introduce yourself after Mass.

If you are a Catholic, we at Holy Nativity receive Holy Communion kneeling and by intinction (both species on the tongue).

If you are not a Catholic, during Communion we invite you either to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest, or fingers across your lips, and receive a blessing from the Priest or Deacon, or remain in your pew and reflect on the presence of Christ.

Recently we were given the 267th Pope by the college of Cardinals. The Church founded by our Lord demonstrated its ability to continue that which was instituted by our Lord nearly 2000 years ago. Our Church is stabilized by her magisterium and led by those who have answered the call to holiness. Do we look to the future for our faith? In today's gospel our Lord looked to the future and considered each of us in relation to that future. Certain elements were needed. A belief in our Lord and in the teachings He left, passed through the teachings and traditions of the Apostles down to our day. There is a need for unity. Our Lord prayed that we all may be one even as He is one with the Father and the Holy Spirit. A unity that is complete.

At times that unity in our Church has been strained and even broken at painful points. Consider the East/West Schism in 1054 AD over the teaching concerning the relationship between the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Such tensions were hardly new. In the first reading, Stephen was stoned to death by fellow Jews who rejected our Lord. Stephen's desire for healing this wound was that God not "lay this sin to their charge." For his part, Stephen prayed for their forgiveness. Seeking forgiveness in the family and conversion for those who were rejecting him. How often do we hold onto anger instead of offering forgiveness to the detriment of relationships.

In a very narrow sense, I know that what we do at Holy Nativity needs to be focused not on ourselves but on the next three or four generations at minimum. If we focus only on the present and make no provision for the future our shortsightedness could doom those who follow. We need to provide a unified effort for the longevity of the Faith. The prayer of our Lord was one that looked at the church literally from beginning to end. His desire was for the church to essentially be "of one heart and mind" in Him, even has He and the Father are one.

The second reading today presents a vision of our ultimate end, eternity with our God in Heaven. While we each generally cross the "finish line" of death individually we are reminded that this is also a team effort. There are those who would like to make what we do in the church an individual effort. However, the vision of Heaven seen in the second reading includes the prayers of the saints before the throne of Heaven for each of us. If this is our future, shouldn't we seek to do our part to establish and maintain a vision for future generations to also find their way to eternal life with God through our teachings and actions here and now?
