Mary has chosen the better part...

Where do you place your priorities?

Have you ever found yourself putting off your prayer time until the end of the day? You want to make sure all the tasks of the day are completed and then collapse into a chair hope and praying that you can stay awake until all your prayers are completed. The prayers can become rushed, half-hearted, or they are not done at all. All this is because they were the last priority and not the first.

This is where Martha was mentally when she rushed up to our Lord and impatiently asked Him to instruct her sister Mary to get up and help her. Her desire for help was understandable from a productivity perspective, yet she was missing out on a key point. To find the spiritual strength needed for the task at hand she also needed to spend time at the feet of the Master.

It would be helpful for us as well to spend more time at the feet of the Master each day. St. Francis de Sales famously said, "Every one of us needs half an hour of prayer a day, except when we are busy – then we need an hour." Martha was gently chided by our Lord for her distractedness with the chores of the day. She needed to spend time with Him first and foremost. Her priorities needed to place time with God first rather than to make it an afterthought when the tasks of the day are done.
