Thank you for sharing in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with us today. Please introduce yourself after Mass.

If you are a Catholic, we at Holy Nativity receive Holy Communion kneeling and by intinction (both species on the tongue).

If you are not a Catholic, during Communion we invite you either to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest, or fingers across your lips, and receive a blessing from the Priest or Deacon, or remain in your pew and reflect on the presence of Christ.

"If then you then have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above..." Colossians 3:1 St. Paul encourages us to always remember that our treasure is not in this life, but in the next. One of the things a person should always consider is who will receive what they have after they die. What have we invested in others, what have we invested in God and the love and service of God. The Catechism tells us our purpose is to know, love, and serve God that we might be happy with Him in Heaven. When Solomon was getting older, he surveyed all that he had amassed and called it vanity. He discovered that all we pursue in terms of wealth and possessions in this life are meaningless in the Kingdom of Heaven.

In today's Gospel our Lord was approached by a young man asking our Lord to tell his brother to share the inheritance. Our Lord used this as an opportunity to teach us that the purpose of life is not amassing a great plunder of wealth in this life, but to seek to deepen our relationship with God. Our Lord teaches the parable of the rich fool. He had an abundant harvest but did not seek to improve the lives of those around him. Seeking to keep it all to himself he decided to increase his storage barns keeping that which he would never be able to use. He was trying to fill the void left by excluding God from his life, he sought to immerse himself in pleasures in this life only to discover just how short his life was.

So, the pursuit of riches and possessions in this life are indeed vanity. Our Lord wants us to know that our greatest good is the love of God and our neighbor. If we are rich toward God and others, we will not be found wanting before the throne of God. This is never a vain pursuit, but the greatest gift of all.
