Do you suppose that I came to bring peace on earth?

When the accolade "Prince of Peace" is used to describe our Lord, we often think of His rule being one of continual good feelings shared by all. Thus, it is rather startling to hear of His rule being characterized by division and hard feelings. Yet we must all acknowledge the truth that not everyone agrees when it comes to matters of religious faith, not even within families. Never was this more true than when my wife joined the Catholic church some twenty-two years ago, only to have her mother strictly forbid that she should ever tell her grandparents. Eight years before, my wife lost her job when we left the Baptist church for the Episcopal church as we made the gradual journey to the Catholic Church.

I believe our Lord's desire is that peace and concord within families reign supreme, yet when faced with a choice between following the world, or even our families, we must follow the Lord. Immediately after my ordination to the priesthood I was questioned by a parishioner, if your wife leaves the church, are you leaving too? As impossible of a scenario it might be, I was quick to reassure. I have come home and have no plan to ever leave.

We are called to take up our cross and follow our Lord. This includes not yielding to peer pressure and going along with the crowd. Our cross may be much heavier when it is resistance from close family. Yet we are not taken off guard, our Lord has warned us that opposition might be our lot. Yet in all this we are comforted, we walk in footsteps of our Lord.
