Welcome to Our Visitors

Thank you for sharing in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with us today. Please introduce yourself after Mass.

If you are a Catholic, we at Holy Nativity receive Holy Communion kneeling and by intinction (both species on the tongue).

If you are not a Catholic, during Communion we invite you either to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest, or fingers across your lips, and receive a blessing from the Priest or Deacon, or remain in your pew and reflect on the presence of Christ.

Our Lord instructs us to strive to enter by the narrow gate. There is a modern mindset that tends to seek the lowest possible commitment to the life of faith. There is a tendency to think that if we "check the block" we are good to go, our place in Heaven is secure. However, our Lord wants a personal relationship with us where we walk with Him every minute of the day. A superficial relationship with the Lord can build a false sense of security.

Our Lord describes a scene where all those who appear before Him will be separated as a shepherd divides the sheep from the goats. Some will enter the Kingdom of Heaven, and others will be sent to eternal separation from God. There will be those who try to proclaim familiarity with Him, "...we ate and drank with You...". Tragically they have no relationship with the Lord. They have an acquaintance with Him as one whom they had seen passing in the street, but never truly developed a relationship.

We are called to something more. We are to seek a deep relationship with our Lord through prayer, study and meditation on Sacred Scripture, and faithfulness to the teachings and traditions of the Church. We are called to seek the contemplative life to the greatest degree. Through these life disciplines we build a relationship to God that sees us standing before a dear friend at our life's end, and not a stranger.

I encourage you this week. Take the time to pray, to be in a relationship with our Lord. The time you spend now with our Lord is the best investment in eternity that you will ever make.
