A NOTE FROM **FATHER DANIEL...**

faith.

What would your life be like if you did not have faith? If you did not believe in God?

We all go through ups and down in our faith and we all at different moments in life might go through some doubts, but through it all, our faith remains, we know God and we know we are not alone. Our sorrows and our joys are different because we have faith, and hopefully we find strength in that

As adults, we might find ourselves struggling to connect our adult lives to our faith and to see how our faith is still relevant. Just as we no longer fit into the outfit we wore on the day of our first Holy Communion, our second grade understanding of our Catholic faith will no longer fit our adult lives. We are continually invited to a deeper, more complete comprehension of our faith so that it can remain relevant in our real lives.

As parents or grandparents, we have a desire to help our children have faith, yet we might find ourselves pulled in so many different directions, driving our children to sports and piano lessons, and so many other things and then somehow trying to find some time for faith. We might want to teach our children how to pray but not be completely certain of how to do it. We might be reaching for answers as our teenage children come to us with hard questions about God, the Church and faith.

As your pastor, I know that there is nothing more important that we can leave our children than faith. What, if not faith, will inspire them to strive to be loving, generous, forgiving and joyful human beings? What, if not faith, will sustain them through the moments of loneliness and sadness, suffering and despair that we all face in life? What, if not faith, will provide them with a real flesh and bone human community, a safe harbor in a broken world in which relationships grow more and more virtual and less real?

That is why in the past couple weeks, along with Dawn Burdick, our new N.E.T. Catholic Pastoral Associate and Faith Formation Coordinator, we have been holding listening sessions with Mary Ann Kozak and Andra Benson first, then with our Catechists/Religious Ed Teachers and finally with parents to see how we can offer a faith formation program that will allow adults to reconnect with their faith and its relevance and give families all the tools to hand on the gift of faith to their children, while offering children and youth a religious ed. experience that will be meaningful yet respectful of their time and their many commitments.

We have heard many good things about the current programs that we will strive to keep; we have also heard of ways in which we could continue to grow in this awesome task of handing on the faith. Given the importance of faith formation, we cannot get comfortable and each year we should ask ourselves: how can we do this better for God and for our children? And then rethink our program according to our answers. As we gear up to recast our faith formation program, we want to offer all of you one more opportunity to give us your input by participating in a survey. You can fill in the survey online at: https://www.netcatholic.org/survey or you can grab a copy in the back of church and return it to us by July 29th. Hopefully by August 4-5, we will be able to present the community with our new Faith Formation Program and a full year schedule that will allow families to plan ahead.
