#### New ways to make your offering easier

**FATHER DANIEL...** I am so grateful to all who contribute to the life of our parishes with their time, talent or treasure. I am especially grateful to those who have increased their offertory amount. I know it is not easy, but it makes a big difference in the finances of our parishes, the quality of service we can provide, and our viability into the future. Thank you! In order to make our offertory process easier and safer, we will now be offering the possibility of electronic giving through our website. This electronic offering feature is completely safe and can be set up as a one-time gift or a recurring gift. This will save you time in terms of writing checks and will also make it much easier to continue to contribute to the parish when you are away for a short trip or for a whole season. We also have the option of setting up direct deposit for those who are not too comfortable with electronic giving. You can fill in a paper form authorizing your bank to make a deposit into our parish account once a month. You might think, well if I do this, what are people going to think about me when they come around for the collection and I do not put anything in? Do not worry, we will provide donation cards at the entrances of each of our churches, so that if you have made a donation through direct deposit or electronic giving, you can take one of those cards when you enter church and put it in the collection when it comes around. That way no one will think that you are not contributing. The more people who sign up for either electronic giving or direct deposit, the easier it will be

This is also a more environmentally conscious option, saving paper that would have gone into collection envelopes and checks. It will also save us some money, having to purchase fewer collection envelopes. Please read the insert in the bulletin this weekend and then fill in the form on the back of the insert or online, so that we know your choice of offering method: electronic, direct deposit, paper collection envelopes or other, and we can then order the envelopes for next year for those who still want them. We want to have this information in by August 12th, so we can order the envelopes by the end of August and have them for you by the end of September, before some of you go away for the winter.


