A Note from Father Daniel

Reopening our Churches

As our region has reached preparedness for reopening, many of you have been asking about reopening our churches. The Diocese is anxiously awaiting clarification about the inclusion of churches in the New York State re-opening plan. We have been working on specific safety protocols to put in place according to federal and state guidelines once we are allowed to resume public worship. We have followed all of the mandates of federal, state and local health officials with the hope that just resolutions will soon be reached for the benefit of the faith communities we serve.

As soon as we hear from the state and from the Diocese, we will let you know. In the meantime, we are putting together our plan for reopening our 3 parish offices and the Regional Finance Office and planning for how some elements of liturgy will be, while we await more specific directives from our Bishop as to how he wants us to proceed regarding liturgy.

We will inform you of all these plans as they come together. This week we can report on one change that will be coming. During Mass we will no longer come around with baskets for the collection to avoid close person to person contact as well as contact with contaminated surfaces.

We encourage all who are already donating electronically to continue to do so. We encourage all who are not yet donating electronically to please consider transitioning to electronic donations. This option is safer in every way and much more efficient, saving us money in collection counting, data entry and envelopes. If you would like to transition to electronic giving but are not sure how, please call our office and we will be happy to help you set it up.

If you insist on continuing to use envelopes for your donations, we ask that you let us know by June 15 (call (607) 241-0821, or email: emmanuel.berrido@dor.org), **since this is the time of year when we have to put in the order for collection envelopes for next year.**

For visitors and the few that continue to use envelopes for their donations as well as for second collections, maintenance collections, candles and other donations starting May 31st, we will have one sacrificial offering station in each of our churches, where you can drop in your donations at any time. There will only be **one** of these stations of each of the churches.

All other donations boxes and slots will either be removed or sealed so that all donations are put into the one more secure sacrificial offering station, and also to limit contact surfaces that have to be disinfected constantly.

The Sacrificial Offering Stations will be a drop box safe and

different colors of envelopes will be provided for the different types of donations such as: regular collection, donation towards deferred maintenance, second collections, candle donations, fair trade coffee donations, coffee hour donations, poor box. If you continue to receive a personalized set of envelopes, then we ask you to use your envelopes and put them directly into the drop box safe.

This is how the stations will look like:

Sacrificial Offering Station



If you do not want to go through the inconvenience of locating the station and having to go to it each time you come to Mass, even if it is not near your usual access point, and also probably having to wait to put your donations in while keeping social distancing, **please transition to electronic giving.**

We understand that some of you might not be familiar with electronic donations so here is some information that will hopefully help you in making the transition:

WeShare is an new online giving platform that our 3 parishes have been using now for two years. It has been very effective, completely secure and accurate in reporting. This online donation processor allows for ACH, Credit Card, and Debit Card transactions. WeShare is managed, designed and built by LPi, or Liturgical Publications. LPi is a long term supplier of our parish bulletins and offers a safer and secure method of managing our online contributors.

Our decision to offer this option two years ago was driven by the desire to offer an easy, safe, and secure way to make contributions to the church, improve consistency of giving, and for the parish save time and money when issuing and processing envelopes. No more worrying about bringing your checkbook or

cash to church, or about which envelopes to use.

The site is certified PCI Level 1 compliant providing the highest level of data security. LPi has never had a breach in the system, and all information is stored securely.

It is important to note that our traditional methods of giving are not going away: you can still use your envelopes, or make cash or check donations at Mass if you wish to continue to do so.

Now, with the new reality the COVID-19 has brought about we must encourage you even more strongly to transition to WeShare, not only to keep money safe and parish operations efficient, as before, but also to keep you and others safe reducing contact with possibly contaminated persons and/or surfaces.

Remember that you could be sick even if you are asymptomatic and the virus can survive up to 72 hours on exterior surfaces, so through the donation you physically put into the safe in church on Saturday or Sunday you could be exposing our Admin Assistant and Collection Counters to the virus as they gather and count on Mondays.

Keep in mind that there will be no collection basket going around during Mass, and if you continue to make your donations physically you will have to deposit them into the **one** Sacrificial Offering Station safe drop box.

Scheduling electronic donations through WeShare will also keep the church financially safe even if for some reason we cannot gather.

An interesting statistic we learned while investigating this process is that on average, Catholics will use 40 of their 52 weekly envelopes in a typical year. Even though the intention to give regularly may be there, sometimes things affect our execution: We may be away for a few weeks or a month in the summer, possibly escape to Florida in the winter, there's a snow weekend with a cancelled Mass, or we are home sick with the flu. And at the next Mass we attend, we may not catch up with the envelopes and donations we missed while we have been away. This on-line method may also enable some Catholics that may not attend Mass regularly to support the church through the year.

You have total flexibility to contribute with a weekly or monthly recurring donation which will happen automatically on the date you choose, which can be modified at any time, or can make one time donations at any time. Donations can be made by direct withdrawal from a savings or checking account, or by credit or debit card, with funds transferred electronically to the proper church account. You can discontinue using the service at any time with no strings attached.

All of our main, second, and deferred maintenance collections are available on WeShare. Parishioners are able to decide what collections they would like to donate to and set up their recurrences how they see fit. They have full access to their accounts for viewing, or editing purposes. Since WeShare records and reports all donations, donors even have full access to their giving history to make their personal reporting, and their tax season easier.

This pandemic has taught us many lessons about what matters most and where our trust must be placed. It has also taught us which might be the best business practices moving forward to minimize the impact on our operations of possible future crisis and to keep all of our members as safe as possible.

One of those practical lessons is that we should all have recurrent donations set up electronically through WeShare.

This way we are certain that the donations come in, they come in directly to our bank account and no one is placed at risk, not counters, not employees, not postal service, not our parishioners.

If you would like to do this but are not very good with computers, please do not worry, just give us a call (607) 241-0821, and we will set it up for you, it will not take more than a 10 minute call.

Thank you all for all the ways in which you continue to support our parishes, as I said will keep you informed on plans and dates for reopening as information becomes available to us and plans come together.

In the meantime continue to join us Monday—Friday for our seven opportunities each day for prayer and learning, especially the celebration of Holy Mass at 9 am. Please also join us for our weekend Masses Saturday at 4:30 pm and Sunday at 8:30 am and 10:30 am.
