

A note from Father Jorge

My dear family of N.E.T. Catholic

I hope all of you have had a great time these weeks of January. It is good to be back. I really enjoyed my time off, visiting some friends and learning new places in the United States. I rested very much, but it is time to restart my work for the Lord through the different liturgical and pastoral activities.



I would like to start with the feast day of St. Blaise. The feast of St. Blaise which is celebrated on February 3rd will be celebrated in the three parishes (All Saints, Holy Cross, and St. Anthony) on the weekend of February 5th & 6th once the Mass is finished, with the blessing of the throats. The blessing of St. Blaise, also known as the blessings of the throats is a very special blessing in which the faithful invoke the Saint's intercession, asking him to protect them from ailments of the throat and every other illness. As with any prayer, the blessing of the throats is not a guarantee that those who receive the blessing will not have ailments of the throat. Rather, it is a prayer for protection from such ailments.



Ash Wednesday (of course Lent season as well) is coming soon on March 2nd. If you have palms from last Palm Sunday, we really would appreciate if you would bring them to be burned for Ash Wednesday. You can leave the palms in a basket at the entrance of each church. Ash Wednesday is one of the most popular and important holy days in the liturgical calendar. Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer. Ash Wednesday takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday, and is chiefly observed by Catholics, although many other Christians observe it too. Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Alternatively, the priest may speak the words, "Repent and believe in the Gospel."



The hours for the Mass and reception of the Ashes will be announced in the next weeks. If you have relatives or friends who are sick and cannot come to the Church and want to receive the Ashes, Confession, Holy Communion, or Anointing, please let us know and Fr. Care for the Marginalized through an Equitable **NYS Budget**

Do you know that nearly 1 in 5 children ages 0-4 in New York lives in poverty? Do you know that children ages 0 -4 are not covered in the Empire State Child Tax Credit? Modest increases in income to low-income families can yield tremendous benefits for children and their families, including improved physical, emotional and behavioral health, and higher educational achievement. The benefits are particularly significant – and most acutely needed – in families with young children. This year, our Diocesan Public Policy Committee is asking parishioners to ask for increased funding in our New York State budget to support those low-income families with small children. Specifically, we're advocating that the Empire State Child tax credit be expanded to include babies and children up to four years old. You'll have the opportunity to sign a petition to our governor and legislators during Public Policy Weekend, February 12-13.
