SCHOOL ENRICHMENT HIGHLIGHTS 2022-2023

STUDENTS AT ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON SCHOOL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO PARTICIPATE IN A VARIETY OF EXTRA- AND CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAMS. THIS YEAR, STUDENTS PARTICIPATED IN THE FOLLOWING:



SCIENCE FAIR - Our students earned the title of “Top SARSEF Middle School” at this year’s science fair, and 7 SEAS students received 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place at the regional competition.



SPORTS - Girls’ Varsity Volleyball placed 1st in the league and 2nd at the tournament. Boys’ Varsity Basketball placed 3rd in the league and JV Boys took 1st place in the league in track & field.

THEATER - Our first Shakespearean theater troupe, Take it Back! formed and students performed sonnets, scenes and soliloquies. Students in grades 3-8 also performed in the musical, Moana, Jr.




CHOIR - Students in 3rd-8th grade led our liturgical music each week in Mass.

SCHOOL ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS 2022-2023

MAP TESTING

One measure of academic growth from year to year is our schoolwide MAP data. This year, our students scored at or above the 50th percentile (given a normal bell curve) in achievement in math, reading, and language usage. Teachers analyzed this schoolwide data and individual student data. This information, combined with classroom assessments and observation, was used to inform instruction.



HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT TEST

In December, SEAS 8th graders took the High School Placement Test (HSPT) through Scholastic Testing Services. This battery of 5 tests measures verbal and quantitative cognitive skills, and basic skills in reading, math, and language. Our 8th graders as a whole ranked nationally in the 75th percentile and scored above average in almost every subject.
