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## BAPTISMS

Baptisms are scheduled on the Second Sunday of the month at 11:30 AM based on parental requests. Participation in a Parent Preparation Program is mandatory before the baptism of the child. Our preparation Program is held on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:00 PM. Attendance at Sunday Mass on the day of the Baptism is Mandatory.

Please call the Parish office to schedule a baptism.

## WEDDINGS

All weddings are scheduled by the Pastor of the Parish. Office staff cannot schedule a wedding and a wedding is not considered to be officially scheduled until the couple receives written confirmation from the Pastor of the Parish. Couples desiring to be married need to speak directly with the Pastor BEFORE reserving a hall. Only the Bride or Groom may request a date for their wedding. Diocesan policy requires that a 6 month (minimum) preparation process be completed prior to the celebration of all weddings. Weddings are not scheduled on Sundays.

## R.C.I.A.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is an ongoing formation process for adults who are interested in becoming a Catholic and adult Catholics who would like to receive the sacraments of Confirmation and/or First Eucharist. Please call the Parish Office for additional information.

## ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Parishioners who are seriously or critically ill, or have surgery scheduled should receive the Sacrament of Anointing and Healing. Please call the parish office to request this sacrament. Regular visits are also made by our Pastoral Staff and Ministers of Care to bring Holy Communion to hospitalized or homebound parishioners. Anyone desiring such a visit should call the Parish Office.

## Announcement - Concerning Mass Times

The Parish Pastoral Council, the Liturgy Commission and I have been discussing our weekend mass schedule for the last eight months. We have conducted a survey of our parishioners and have shared the results with you in the bulletin in mid-January.

At the heart of this discussion has been the mission that our Lord Jesus has given each of us as his disciples both as individuals and as members of this parish and the Catholic Church. It's a simple, straight forward mission but a mission that is fraught with difficulties in our culture and society. The mission is simply this: “*Then Jesus approached and said to them, ‘All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.’*” (Matthew 28:18-20)

This is our mission as Catholics, as disciples, as members of St. Paul the Apostle Parish – to bring people to Our Lord and God, to be his instrument in the making of new disciples and in the strengthening of one another in faith. We have seen a significant decline in Mass attendance at the weekend Masses at our parish. You can see evidence of this in the empty pews each Sunday. Seventy-eight percent (78%) of our parishioners who responded to the question in our survey regarding whether adding an evening mass would help our mass attendance responded positively. Eight percent (8%) responded negatively while the other fourteen percent (14%) were unsure.

Our Parish Pastoral Council, with the concurrence of our Liturgy Commission, has recommended to me that we add a 6:00 pm Sunday evening mass (without music) and leave the Sunday morning schedule as is on a three to six month trial basis. They have also recommended that we count mass attendance at every mass and then after the trial period make a final decision on what our Sunday schedule should be going forward based on actual mass attendance. # LENT

Pray + Fast + Give

### Lenten Regulations:

Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.


To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

Those who are sick, pregnant, or nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

## Second Sunday of Lent, Cycle C

### Sunday, March 17, 2019

#### Gospel Reading [Luke 9:28b-36](#)

Jesus is transfigured in the presence of Peter, John, and James

#### Family Connection

In today's Gospel, the voice from heaven speaks to the disciples saying, "Listen to him." The Transfiguration was a focused moment for the disciples when they heard God speaking to them and experienced Jesus in glory. They most certainly left this focused moment with a new appreciation for the importance of Jesus' words even if they did not yet understand everything that he had taught them. During Lent, we are invited to consider our attentiveness to Jesus and to one another. In the pace and noise that often characterizes family life, how well do we listen to one another? What opportunities do we have for quiet prayer?

As you gather as a family, count the number of pieces of equipment in your home that produce sound: televisions, radios, CD players, computers, video games, etc. Observe if sometimes more than one piece of equipment is playing simultaneously and how this might affect communication. Discuss the question: What is it like to try to talk with one another when this equipment is on?


Read aloud today's Gospel, Luke 9:28-36. Consider whether the noise and pace of your family life allows family members opportunities for quiet prayer. During Lent, it may be appropriate for your family to choose a time for quiet in the household by turning off televisions, radios, and CD players. Consider whether your family would like to establish such a time during this Season of Lent and suggest that it might allow you the opportunity to listen more attentively to one another and to find time for quiet prayer. Spend a few such moments as a family, asking God to help you listen well to one another and to Jesus.

#### Our Lenten Retreat

Lent lies at the very heart of our Catholic faith. Each year, on Ash Wednesday, we begin our Lenten retreat. We are blessed with ashes, reminding that we are dust and to dust we will return. For the next 40 days we are led into the desert of our own hearts to look within, face our sins, and ask for God's mercy.

While Lent was originally intended as a time of preparation for those being baptized at Easter, it gradually became a time when all of us got ready to renew our own baptismal promises . It is the season in which we prepare both individually and as a Church for the Second Coming of our Lord and Savior. It is the season when we reflect on the dying and rising of Christ that has made our salvation possible. Even more than that, it is the season when we enter into Christ's dying and rising as we seek to purify, cleanse, and nourish our bodies, minds and souls.

The best Lent is one in which we enter the season wholeheartedly. All too often people either take on too much or don't take on enough. The solution is to simplify our lives, focus our intentions and concentrate more clearly on our spiritual goals.


