WEDDINGS

All weddings are scheduled by the Pastor of the Parish. Office staff cannot schedule a wedding and a wedding is not considered to be officially scheduled until the couple receives written confirmation from the Pastor of the Parish. Couples desiring to be married need to speak directly with the Pastor BEFORE reserving a hall. Only the Bride or Groom may request a date for their wedding. Diocesan policy requires that a 6 month (minimum) preparation process be completed prior to the celebration of all weddings. Weddings are not scheduled on Sundays.

FROM FATHER JOHN: “*There are those who seek knowledge for the sake of knowledge; that is Curiosity. There are those who seek knowledge to be known by others; that is Vanity. There are those who seek knowledge in order to serve; that is Love.*” ~ St. Bernard of Clairvaux

Damien Woody was an offensive lineman who played for twelve years in the NFL. He played for the New England Patriots, Detroit Lions and the New York Jets. When he played for the Jets, he sent his children to St. Vincent’s Catholic School even though his family wasn’t Catholic. A parent of another child, a Catholic child, asked him why he sent his non-Catholic child to a Catholic school. He answered, “My wife and I believe that a school where they love God will love my children.”

Catholic schools are important to our community and our nation because of love; because we love our children and they experience God’s love in our schools. They experience that love through their teachers, the office staff, the principal, the maintenance staff, the people who volunteer in the school, and the other children.

Bishop Conlon is asking every parish in our diocese to support Catholic schools by implementing a new parish assessment for all parishes that do not have a Catholic school. Bishop Conlon believes, and I agree, that support of Catholic education is every Catholic’s responsibility whether or not their local parish has a school. The following is Bishop Conlon’s *Statement Regarding New Parish Assessment For Schools*.

“The Diocese of Joliet is blessed with excellent schools, thanks to the dedication of many people. Parishes with schools provide \$14 million for those schools each year. The Schools Task Force concluded, however, that for a few struggling elementary schools outside financial support is essential. They recommended, and I agreed after further consultation, to introduce a new parish assessment.

Some people ask if the “diocese” can help these schools. The Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal and the existing 5% parish assessment, plus some investment income, fund the diocesan central services and other obligations. There really is no significant money left over.

Why are parishes without schools expected to provide financial support for struggling schools? The essential answer is that solid Catholic education is a resource that should be available to every family wherever possible. If some parishes do not operate schools, they should still help support schools to assure that their own families continue to have access to Catholic schools. The fewer schools that operate in the Diocese of Joliet, the fewer options families have for Catholic education.

There was a time when having a school was as common a part of parish life. Today parishes are finding increasingly the benefit of collaborating with their neighbors to operate various programs rather than duplicating everything. Why not look at schools that way?

The new assessment on regular collections will take effect on July 1, 2020 and will generate around \$560,000 annually. It will be graduated, depending on the financial strength of each parish, with 3% being the average rate and 5% being the highest rate. Even with the new assessment, our diocese will still be below the average assessment rate for parishes in the nearly 200 dioceses in the United States. (The parishes in Ford County and Iroquois County will not be subject to the new assessment, because no Catholic schools operate among the very small rural parishes there.)

Some parishes already contribute regularly to the support of underfunded schools. The continuation of that support is essential. Any parish that contributes to a *designated* school or schools, at an amount equivalent to or above its assessment rate, will not need to pay the school assessment.

The amount collected each fiscal year as a result of this new assessment will go into a separate diocesan fund. I have appointed a five-member Grant Commission to receive grant applications from schools truly in need of additional funding. In addition, the commission is charged with working with school officials and others to find ways to strengthen these schools in order to reduce their need for grants.

There should be less need for “out of parish” tuition rates, at least for families that contribute regularly to their own parish in the Diocese of Joliet, since all parishes will be supporting Catholic schools. Likewise, I am hopeful that the assessment will spur increased enrollment in Catholic schools from among families whose parishes do not operate one.

As your bishop, I am committed to providing quality Catholic school education in the Diocese of Joliet, just as I am committed to providing quality religious formation programs for our families whose children attend public schools. Life has changed. Not every parish chooses or can operate an elementary school. Yet we all still need to have them available for the future health of the Church and society.”

The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica



Christians first met in homes to hear Jesus' teachings and to celebrate the Eucharist. When the Christians were no longer persecuted for their faith, they built beautiful churches. Sometime before the fourth century, a palace owned by a noble Roman family named Laterani had been built. It became the property of the Emperor Constantine. Constantine had recognized Christianity as the religion of the empire, and he donated to the Church the palace and other buildings on the site. This became Rome's oldest church. It was given the title Basilica of the Savior, but later was dedicated to John the Baptist and called St. John Lateran. St. John Lateran was the home of the popes—the center of the Catholic world for many years. Twenty-eight popes are buried there. Although our pope now lives at the Vatican and presides at St. Peter's basilica, St. John Lateran is considered his cathedral as the bishop of Rome. The dedication of this basilica is a happy occasion for the Church because it reminds us of our beginnings, our unity. It stands as a monument to God and all that God does through the Church.

Many churches promise a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, son of God. The Catholic Church is the same church founded by Christ himself. If you have never been baptized, were baptized in another Christian faith tradition, or never received First Communion or Confirmation, consider finding the fullness of faith in the church that has endured over 2,000 years since the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. We offer the complete unedited scriptures, a deep tradition of prayer, the presence of Christ in His sacraments, and the fullness of his presence in the Sacrament of His Body and [Blood](#).
