



MADE ONE IN HIM

The Feast of Corpus Christi provides the opportunity to reflect on the core meaning of the Eucharistic Mystery. Certainly, it is important to stress that we receive the Body and Blood, soul and divinity of Christ in Holy Communion; but equally important is that in receiving his Body and Blood, we participate in the Sacrifice which Christ offered for our salvation upon the altar of the Cross.

Indeed, the origin of Christ's presence in the Holy Eucharist is his lifegiving Sacrifice. As our beloved Pope Emeritus recalled, ...the changing of the substance of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is the fruit of the gift that Christ made of himself, the gift of a Love stronger than death, divine Love which raised him from the dead.

This is why the Eucharist is the Bread of Life. For, by partaking of the Body which was crucified for us and the Blood which was poured out for us, we "enter into communion with the very life of Jesus, into the dynamism of this life which is given to us and for us," the very definition of salvation.

When we eat regular food, it becomes part of us and nourishes our bodies. When we eat the Body and Blood of the Lord, we become one with him, a member of his Body. We are freed from selfishness and sin, inserted into the Person of Jesus and into the life of the Blessed Trinity.

This is what Jesus means when he says that "whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." By being made one with Christ, we are also made one with each other. This is why we pray in the Second Eucharistic Prayer that "partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ, we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit," and why can ask God to "gather to yourself all your children scattered throughout the world."
