



THIS SUNDAY'S WORD

The introduction to this parable should wake us up to the reality of the evil one in our midst. The specific action of the "enemy" in this parable is disturbing. Imagine if this story were true and you were the farmer who worked very hard at sowing the seed throughout your field. Then, if you awoke to hear the news that weeds had been sown also, you would be quite saddened, angered and disappointed.

But this parable is especially about the Son of God. Jesus is the one who has sown the good seed of His Word and watered that seed with His Precious Blood. But the evil one, the devil, has also been at work trying to undermine the work of our Lord.

Again, if this were a true story about you as a farmer, it would be hard to refrain from much anger and a desire for revenge. But the truth is that Jesus, as the Divine Sower, does not allow the evil one to steal His peace. Instead, He has allowed this action of the evil one to remain for now. But in the end, the works of evil will be destroyed and burned in the unquenchable fire.

What's also interesting to note is that Jesus does not root out all evil in our world here and now. According to the parable, He refrains so that the good fruit of the Kingdom will not be negatively affected. In other words, this parable reveals to us the interesting truth that the "weeds" all around us, that is, the evil alive within our world, cannot affect our growth in virtue and entrance into the Kingdom of God. We may have to endure evil on a daily basis and find ourselves surrounded by it at times, but our Lord's willingness to allow evil for now is a clear sign that He knows it cannot affect our growth in virtue if we do not let it.

Reflect, today, upon the reality of evil in our world. It's essential that you name evil activity for what it is. But evil cannot ultimately affect you. And the evil one, despite his malicious attacks, will ultimately be defeated. Reflect upon the hope that this truth brings and renew your trust in the power of God this day.

"REMEMBER TO KEEP HOLY THE LORD'S DAY"

Jesus rose from the dead on the first day of the week. Because it is the "first day," the day of Christ's Resurrection recalls the first creation. For Christians it has become the first of all days, the first of all feasts, the Lord's Day – Sunday.

The Old Testament Sabbath (Saturday) has been replaced by the Lord's Day of the New Testament (Sunday). Sunday is a day of grace and rest from work. The institution of the Lord's Day helps everyone enjoy adequate rest and leisure to cultivate their familial, cultural, social, and religious lives. It is also a day traditionally consecrated by Christian piety to good works and humble service of the sick, the infirm, and the elderly.

The Third Commandment commands:

 Worship of God by assisting at Mass on Sundays, the Lord's Day, and on Holy Days.

The Third Commandment forbids:

- Missing Mass through one's own fault on Sundays or Holy Days. The Catechism explains that a person may be excused from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass for "serious reasons" such as illness or the care of infantes or loved one who are ill and cannot be left alone.
- Doing unnecessary servile (physical) work on Sunday. Servile
 work is allowed when the honor of God, our own need, or
 that of our neighbor requires it. Examples of servile work are
 cutting the grass, painting the house, changing the oil in the
 car, building a house and raking leaves.
- Making others do unnecessary servile work on Sunday.
- Conducting unnecessary business -or shopping- on Sunday.
