

#### THIS SUNDAY'S WORD

In today's Gospel, we have Jesus working on a sabbath in a synagogue. He is going to upset everyone by choosing to cure someone on the sabbath in a synagogue. A double challenge!!

Today we have Jesus the dynamic, eloquent persuasive teacher. Everyone was astonished at his brilliance. Then there is the account of the exorcism, with the evil spirits identifying Jesus as the Messiah, sandwiched between the theme of Jesus Power, the Power of His Word. He not only speaks the truth, but he also does it.

The members of the synagogue recognized that Jesus had a new teaching. They, however, did not recognize the Good News, how He was not just from God, but the Son of God.

How fortunate we are to know the Truth. Jesus the "persuasive teacher, and there is the power in Jesus' word, which is one of a new teaching with authority!

Isn't it fascinating that even today, the Gospel seems to be so new, revolutionary, and has authority? We are not talking about legal or political authority, but moral authority, a way of living a meaningful life; the one God has given you, not the one people tell you that you should live. That is the purpose of the Catholic Church, to preserve and interpret for the current time, the teachings of Christ in the Gospel and help us find our true selves as God intends.

Many things can distract us from that, but with the grace of God and the Holy Spirit, we can pull ourselves together as a Church and also our own very selves.

How do we do that? Let Jesus be your teacher. Get to know Him. Read the Scripture and what the Church teaches; pray and you will find yourself and your purpose. As a disciple of Jesus, what is your role? Once you figure that out, you are on your way. It may involve being a parent, a faithful spouse, a student, whatever you are becoming.

We all have phases in our lives, different calls from God, and there should be joy when we listen to the call when it comes. Some calls will be more challenging than others, when Jesus speaks to us, it is good to listen. If we do listen, his teaching will be powerful and liberating.

Add God and Jesus to your life, and you will find more meaning and enjoy life so much more. Let the Lord teach you as today's scripture asks of us.

#### MASS INTENTIONS

One of the greatest works of charity is to pray for the living and the dead. The greatest and most powerful prayer we have is the Mass, since the fruits of the Mass are the very fruits of Jesus' redemption. For that reason, all are encouraged to have Mass offered for a deceased loved one; for health and healing of a person who is sick or suffering; for a living person who is celebrating a birthday, anniversary or other special moment in their life; in thanksgiving to God, our Blessed Mother or a saint; or simply for a special intention.
