
DAILY BREAD FOOD PANTRY

NOVEMBER-

DEVOTION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS November 1, 2019, is not only All Saints Day, but it is the First Friday of the month. We are reminded of the great gift of love that Jesus gave us through the shedding of His Precious Blood in His Passion and Death on the Cross. Once again we continue our tradition here at Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish by celebrating our monthly devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Our day will begin with the celebration of Mass at 7:00 AM in the Chapel of the Holy Spouses, Mary and Joseph, followed by exposition and adoration of the REAL PRESENCE of JESUS in the Most Blessed Sacrament until 12 noon. The rosary will be prayed every hour on the half hour following Mass. All are invited to take 6 minutes from your busy schedule to spend some time in personal prayer with Jesus during these hours. At 12 noon, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be prayed followed by Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament, bringing our devotion to a close.

The Sacrament of Penance is available each morning after the <u>7 AM</u> Mass, as well as during the regular office hours or by appointment in the rectory, or the regular hours on Saturday afternoon in the upper church.

ALL SAINTS DAY MASS SCHEDULE

November 1st is All Saints Day and is a Holy Day of obligation for all Catholics. On this day we celebrate the Church Triumphant, those who lived a virtuous life or even gave their life (martyred) rather than deny Christ. A saint is one who has been declared by the Church to be living eternally with God in heaven. The saints are our model and intercede for us in the heavenly court. The vigil Mass will be celebrated at 7 PM on Thursday, October 31st and at 7 AM on Friday, November 1st.

All Masses will be celebrated in the Chapel of the Holy Spouses, Mary and Joseph.

In addition, a special shrine of several First Class relics (actual tiny piece of a saint's bone) will be displayed for personal veneration and intercession. (i.e. St. Anthony of Padua, St. Gaspar Bertoni, St. Maria Goretti, St. Theresa of the Child Jesus, and several more) following Mass and until 12 noon on Friday.

Earlier this summer I received a letter from the Provincial of the Daughters of Our Lady of Mercy, inviting me to attend the 100th anniversary celebration of their arrival in the United States. The celebration was to be held at their motherhouse in Newfield, New Jersey. It was at the request of the Stigmatine Fathers that the Daughters of Our Lady of Mercy came to this country where they established their first community in June 1919 at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Parish in Springfield, Ma. and in December, 1919 to Hazleton, PA and our parish, wherein the sisters served until June 1977 as educators in the school. Unfortunately due to commitment I was unable to attend the celebration. In a conversation with Fr. Leonard we decided that our Stigmatine Community in the parish would remember the Sisters on their milestone in their history. To be clear no gift, no donation came from the parish resources. I am privileged to share the letter I received from their Provincial, Sr. M. Ambrogina, DM. Your sincere and inspiring words touched the hearts of all as we shared your letter with our guests on the day of the celebration--an awesome and treasured moment in which to thank God for having received a special call from God through the Stigmatine Fathers 100 years ago. It was God's provident plan for both religious congregations. We will never forget the years our sisters spent at Sacred Heart Parish. The people were always warm, generous and most gracious to any of our sisters who had the privilege of serving there.
