

Following the 11:00am Mass Sunday we'll have multiple priests available here to celebrate the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** with you. Take advantage of this opportunity to put John the Baptist's words into action by

making a good Confession of sins before we celebrate Jesus' birth.

Additional Advent **Penance services** with multiple priests for Confession will be: St. Anthony Gwinn *this Tuesday, December 7th* at 6:00pm; St. Michael Marquette on *December 13th* at 7:00pm; St. Christopher on *December 17th* at 7:00pm; St. Peter Cathedral on *December 20th* at 7:00pm; and St. Louis the King on *December 21st* at 7:00pm. With the **Covid vaccine booster** now available I want to remind everyone of the duty to inform yourselves about getting vaccinated. Vaccination is not obligatory, but is a proven way to promote public health. The Church upholds the duty to act according to one's conscience, and also obliges us to form our conscience. Each person must weigh the benefits and risks of vaccination and make a free and informed decision. As time goes along, more info is available about effectiveness and risks. It would be negligent just to say, 'It's not my problem.' In my case, I chose to get vaccinated because I judged the personal and public health benefits to be proportional to any risk of side-effects, and it was necessary for me in order to enter nursing homes and fulfill my priestly duties. Others may judge the risk of side-effects and burdens outweigh the benefits. That's fine as long as the person has taken the time to research and weigh available evidence. I encourage you to take the time to do so. Also, since the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines do not use cell lines derived from fetal tissue in their production, they are to be preferred.
