FROM THE DESK of Father Ryan

This weekend is the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Scripture readings are about repentance and forgiveness. In the 1st reading, Moses intercedes for the people, who had broken their relationship with God by worshipping the golden calf and succumbing to sexual temptation. The people deserve destruction, but Moses appeals to God's covenant with Abraham after the willing sacrifice of Isaac his son. This foreshadows the sacrifice Christ will make for us, to bring us the mercy of God. In the psalm, David pleads for God to 'create' in him a 'clean heart,' which is not possible by human power. Like the Israelites, David succumbed to sexual temptation. Unlike Israel, David repents when rebuked, and returns to seek the Lord. In the 2nd reading, St. Paul reminds us that he himself – like David and Israel - was a great offender against God, but received mercy. He reminds us that Saints are those who embraced the mercy of God rather than those who never needed it. In the Gospel, Jesus shows it is a God-like trait to associate with sinners. Jesus offers us the path to leave the pig slop we've been wallowing in and return to God, who is waiting to embrace us. We do this through acts of repentance and renunciation. We have to leave the pig sty before we return to the Father, who wants all his children to share his love and joy. Let us quickly get up from our sins and return to the Father!

This week, Monday is the memorial of *The Most Holy Name of Mary*; Tuesday is the memorial of *St. John Chrysostom*, bishop and doctor of the Church; Wednesday is the feast of *The Exaltation of the Holy Cross*; Thursday is the memorial of *Our Lady of Sorrows*; and Friday is the memorial of *Saints Cornelius*, Pope, and *Cyprian*, bishop and martyrs. Saints of God, pray for us!

Please pray for *Rose Fleck* and *Janet Lafond*, whose funerals were this past week. *Eternal rest grant unto them*, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them!
