



Sacramental Outreach Ministry

+MISSION STATEMENT+

To service parishioners who, because of illness, injury, or lack of mobility are unable to attend Mass and desire the Sacraments of the Blessed Sacrament, Reconciliation, and/or Anointing.

+Ministry Overview+

Sacramental Outreach Ministers (SOMs) visit private homes, nursing homes, assisted living and rehabilitation facilities, sharing the Word of God from Mass, carrying the Eucharistic Presence of Christ and facilitating priestly visits upon request.

Prospective communicants must be initially visited and assessed by a priest who offers Anointing and/or Reconciliation. Upon final priestly approval the Sacramental Outreach Minister is assigned to bring the TRUE PRESENCE and joy of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament to the communicants unable to attend Mass. A simple and brief Communion rite is reverently performed by the minister. The schedule of visits is most often weekly, but can be adjusted to meet the individual circumstances of the communicant as well as that of the minister. SOM volunteers can typically perform their ministry in as little as one or more hours per week, depending on the number of communicants assigned. Diocese and parish training and orientation is provided as well as ongoing support. This ministry is the most rewarding and fulfilling way to serve our Lord, our parish community and our church.

<u>FAQs</u>

Who are the Sacramental Outreach Ministers (SOMs)? They are Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist. They are parishioners over the age of 18 who are in good standing with the Catholic Church, the Diocese of West Palm Beach and the Parish of St Anastasia.

What are the prerequisites for becoming a SOM? SOM candidates are required to provide documentation proving Catholic baptism, Holy Communion, Confirmation and Catholic Marriage (if married). A background check and fingerprinting is also required.

What do SOMs do? SOMs visit parishioners who, because of a disability, are not able to attend Mass. The SOM performs a brief reverent communion rite during which the Blessed Sacrament is given to the communicant.

Where do the SOMs do their ministry? The SOM will provide his/her service at either a communicant's private residence or in a nursing facility.

When do SOMs perform their ministry? SOMs and communicants will see each other at any mutually agreed to time during the course of a seven-day week. Visits occur directly after the SOM has received the Eucharist from a priest at Mass.

Why are SOMs necessary? Every baptized Catholic is compelled to help save souls. We believe that this is our ultimate goal and we do so reverently with joy and commitment.

How do SOMs perform their solemn and sacred responsibilities? SOMs are provided both diocesan and parish orientation and training.

How much time does it take the SOM to perform this weekly ministry? Typically following a Mass, the SOM should be able to complete his/her duties in as little as one hour. The actual time does, however, also depend on travel, the number of communicants and the level of socialization that one desires to have.

What other responsibilities do SOMs have? Upon a communicants appeal SOMs are required to request that a priest visit the homebound for the purpose of Anointing and/or Reconciliation. SOMs are also expected to log each visit with the Church Office and to report any



ITALY, 1227


This Eucharistic miracle was performed directly by Saint Anthony after he was challenged by a certain Bonovillo to demonstrate the truth of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The most ancient biography of Saint Anthony, L'Assidua (The Untiring), carries Bonovillo's exact words: "Father! I tell you before all these people: I will believe in the Eucharist if my mule, after fasting for three days, adores the Host which you offer him rather than eating the fodder which I give him." The mule, despite the fact that it was exhausted by hunger, knelt before the Host and refused its food.



Spotlight

This mission of the Bereavement Ministry is to provide support, planning, and education to Saint Anastasia Catholic Church families as they review their end of life arrangements.

The Core Ministers are trained to respond to grieving families appropriately and assist Priests with the immediate care to families when a family calls the church to inform us of a member's passing.



Grieving with Great Hope

The Grieving with Great Hope program provides grief support to families in a small group setting.

St. Anastasia parishioner, Rita Gilchrist, spearheads the program that provides affirmation to the grieving process.

The program has supported 22 families and is provided at the beginning of the year before Lent.

Frequently Asked Questions

When to call a Priest?

The parish priest of the person who is ill should be informed as soon as serious illness befalls a person – or when serious surgery is scheduled—so that the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick can be administered along with the Sacrament of Reconciliation, if possible. Pastoral care for the sick person should be asked for as soon as a person experiences the danger of illness or is chronically ill, particularly if the person is elderly.

What do I do when my loved one has passed away? Once death occurs, please notify the parish office so that arrangements for funeral services may begin.

What is the difference between a Funeral Mass and a Memorial Mass?

A Funeral Mass has the body of the deceased or the cremated remains of the deceased present and has all the special prayers attributed to that Mass. When the body or the cremated remains are not present it is called a Memorial Mass.

What should I do with my loved ones cremains after the Funeral Mass?

If a Catholic family chooses cremation, the Church requires reverent disposition of the ashes. The Vatican says the ashes must be treated in the same way a body would be. The ashes are to be kept in a sacred place not in one's home, scattered, or divided among family members. They should be laid to rest in a cemetery either in a grave or mausoleum blessed by a priest following the Funeral Mass.
