



The following letter is from Cardinal Dolan:

"September 18, 2022 Month of the Seven Sorrows of Mary

Dear friends in the Lord:

Whenever I receive letters from parishioners, none cheers me more than when I read how much the faithful love their priests. And as you know, almost all of them were educated and formed at St. Joseph's Seminary, Dunwoodie, which just celebrated its 125th anniversary this past year.

Our seminarians are not only the future shepherds of our flock, but they will also be spiritual guides and leaders in our wider communities. We must be sure that they are as well prepared as possible to serve the Church in New York. And for the last century and a quarter, Dunwoodie has been that place of formation, Thousands of holy, dedicated, and faithful priests have been ordained over these years. It is nationally renowned, held in the highest regard by bishops from around the country. Each year, other dioceses and religious orders send their candidates to our priestly formation program.

As I write to you today and express my gratitude for last year's contribution of \$343,409, I ask you to consider in your own prayer, a sacrificial gift to the *Annual Seminary Appeal*. It will be collected on the weekend of September 25, 2022. Your support will provide tuition, room and board, academic training and spiritual formation for our archdiocesan seminarians and the others who are studying there and help prepare these young men to become great priests who will inspire future letters of admiration.

The priesthood is a life of sacrifice and service. As you know, we do not have as many men making the commitment to serve as priests as we did years ago, and I am so grateful to those who accept the Lord's call. Message from Father Pergjini:

The students started school; public and our parochial school. At the end of this month, we will welcome with joy the students enrolled in our religious education program (CCD.) On behalf of our parish, we thank them and all the parents who are entrusting their children to our teachers and staff to be prepared for the sacraments of first Holy Communion and Confirmation. It is a very important step in the lives of our young students. They will learn a religious subject that they can never learn in the public school: how to love and to know God and how to live God's commandments properly using the sacraments of confession and Holy Communion, and the gifts of the Holy Spirit received in the sacrament of confirmation. We are aware that today is not the same experience as it used to be many years ago. Back then faith was very important in the public life and the majority of the faithful practiced their faith. Today there are many single parents who struggle to raise their children in the best way they can. Many of them must work even on Sundays which makes things very difficult for them to attend Holy Mass together as a family. Some of them, unfortunately, do not practice their faith at all. This is the major issue that we have to face every year: mass attendance on Sundays. Every year, in our orientation program, we make it very clear to every parent that mass attendance on Sundays and Holy days of obligation is mandatory for all students. We try to explain to our parents that teaching in the classroom is meant to prepare the students of what takes place during the celebration of the Holy Mass on Sundays. The celebration of the Holy Mass is the most essential part of our faith where the divine sacrifice takes place and, we, as Catholics, believe that Christ is present in the consecrated bread and wine that become His Body and Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ. We admire many of the parents who take this obligation seriously and to bring along with you your son and daughter to attend mass not only when it is required, but, faithfully every Sunday and the holy days of obligation. We hope and pray that this demanding requirement is properly understood to help you as parents and through you, your child will remember that one day whatever they learned by the good examples of their parents and teachers will help them to communicate the same message to their own children one day, God willing! On the other hand, there are unpleasant moments for us when we see a student coming to Mass alone. As we see the parents dropping off their children and come back later when mass is over to pick them up, instead of being with them during the whole time of the celebration. Sometimes it becomes worse when some of the students come at the end of the mass only to sign the Mass card. These unpleasant experiences happen because the control and the good examples of the parents are missing. We can never replace or pretend to do what parents are meant to accomplish in their homes. In the home at a very young age, we all have learned the first prayer, the most essential one, the sign of the cross and the many other prayers. Our families are meant to be the first domestic church where we have learned how to pray and know and love God. We understand that we have to be patient and loving with everyone, trying to explain the importance of practicing our faith. This is to help all of us, especially your sons and daughters who need to be exposed to the beauty of the liturgy, and, we together with them, worship and give praise to Almighty Father through our Lord Jesus Christ. Only in this way, and no other way, your children will start to understand the effects of those humble words and prayers taught by mom and dad, and their good examples of being with them at Mass every Sunday. We are blessed to have many of you as part of our community who practice your faith and are willing to teach by example to our future generation. This is a moment we thank all of you as parents for saying yes to life and raising your children in our catholic faith by word and deed. It is a blessing for all of us to see many children, your children, your joy and your life, in the church and see in them the future of our church and our country. Every Sunday, we are gathered to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, in that spirit of thanksgiving; we are thankful to Almighty Father for you and your children. We take this opportunity to thank our religious director, our dedicated teachers who every year are willing to sacrifice their time and talents to teach and share our Catholic faith with our future generation. Our catechists are faithful people of our parish who are willing to volunteer and prepare our students for the sacraments. They are people of sound integrity who faithfully participate every single Sunday at the Holy Sacrifice of the mass and live their faith by good example. We are thankful and grateful to all of them for their help to our parish. We are sure that their teaching experience of our Catholic faith is inspiring and rewarding to our students and to our parents. Finally, we hope and pray that together we will give good examples to our students who are beginning to learn about our faith, what we believe and profess every Sunday after the homily: The Creed, as we all stand saying: "I believe in one God the Father Almighty." The Lord's Prayer: what we firmly hope, as we all together recite with great joy and confidence those powerful words taught by Christ himself, before we receive Holy Communion. The Ten Commandments help all of us, as young adults, what to do and what not to do. The Seven sacraments, from which, we receive the grace and are restored into the life of Christ. These will be the basic elements to be taught to our students to know and love God. This is the only way, and there is no other way, that we can enter the path of our salvation by being obedient to His voice and following Him. Yes, indeed, we hear his voice who speaks through the voice of our catechists, from your voice dear parents who pray along with your children before and after meals, when you and your children pray before you go to sleep and when you wake up in the morning, from the voice of the priest and deacon at the pulpit every Sunday at Mass. Finally, His real presence on the altar: body, blood, soul, and divinity. We hope and pray that our students may follow Christ, the Way, the Truth, and the Life for ever and ever!

Amen! May God bless our students, their parents, our volunteers and dedicated catechists. May Our Blessed Mother and Saint Benedict intercede for all of us!
