Message from Fr. Pergjini:

"Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God"? **Luke 11: 18-19.** It is a powerful question that Christ asked to the one who came to thank him, and at the same time was pointing out the ingratitude of those who were cured but did not come to thank Christ who cured them. The Samaritan came glorifying God in a loud voice and fell at the feet of Christ, thanking him. Falling at the feet of Christ is a gesture of worship, a gesture of gratitude, and thanksgiving. This question is very well addressed to all of us, as well. We peacefully and prayerfully reflect upon this question for those times when we have failed to give thanks to our Savior and Redeemer, but also when we have failed to thank others for any favor done to us, and when we have been hurt by others who never recognized what we have done for them. It is very hurtful when others do not show any sign of gratitude for what we have done for them. However, our disappointments can never be compared with what Christ does for us, and how Christ is looking at us when we fail to be thankful to Him. The Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is a powerful moment of Thanksgiving. We thank Him with whole hearts, minds, and souls for being in the presence of our Living God on the Altar; Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Unfortunately, there are many Catholics after having received the sacraments stop coming to Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation. The parents have the good intention to baptize their children, register for religious instructions and prepare them for receiving the sacraments. Their presence in the church stops after the beautiful ceremonies of baptism, first holy communion, and confirmation. They come again only when they are invited to a baptism, first holy communion, confirmation, wedding or a funeral. Whether or not we like it the words of Christ "where are the other nine" are addressed to those who do not give thanks to Christ, who are ungrateful for what we have, the most powerful sacrifice that takes place on the Altar. Sunday celebration of the Holy Eucharist is the Day of the Lord, the Day of our hope and joy. Do we seriously take the need and obligation to come and pray at Holy Mass every Sunday and Holy Days of obligation? We all must go back to the moment when we were baptized. Our baptism, hopefully we know the date and year of our baptism, is the greatest gift that we have received, becoming Christians and belonging to Christ Our Savior. We were baptized in the Name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and received the faith, and the promise of Eternal life. Unfortunately, many of us take for granted what we have received and are not aware of the need to be thankful and grateful to Christ. Our baptism, and other sacraments are related to one another and impossible to separate the one from the other. Christ is present in every Sacrament we receive and have the intimate encounter with the one who heals our broken souls. How can we excuse ourselves before our Savior who asks the question where are the other nine? "The other nine" it can very well include many of us who for our fault forget what we have received, and our obligation to be thankful, to come to worship, to be at the feet of Our Savior. We think of our first confession when we were forgiven and embraced by His love, and peacefully and prayerfully received the Body of Christ. Unfortunately, not our fault sometimes, our parents or others did not faithfully practice their faith. Many of us grew up without knowing the obligation and necessity to come and worship on Sunday, the day of the Risen Christ, and the day our hope. The question where are the other nine very well means that we have forgotten to come on the day when Christ defeated death and gave us the promise of Eternal Life. There are many questions that we can ask ourselves that are not mentioned here, but we all hope and pray to experience the need, the indispensable need to ask forgiveness for those times that we have been ungrateful to Him and to one another. It is essential to know that Saint Paul considers the most grievous sin, the root of all sins, the absence of gratitude toward Christ.

In the letter to the <u>Romans 1: 21</u> it is very clear that the great saint speaks about those who do not honor him as God or do not give thanks to him as our savior. Our human nature is exposed to many temptations and contaminated culture of today which ignores and removes God from the center of lives brings devastating consequences to our souls.

I hope and pray that we all must make a good examination of our conscience reading and reflecting this passage of Saint Luke, and like the Samaritan, on our knees confess our sins, and come to worship the Living God on the Altar, and thank Christ for belonging to Him for Eternity.
