

Due to the current restrictions and health concerns presented by the pandemic, we have made some temporary adjustments to our adult child protection training requirements. All employees and volunteers who may have contact with children continue to be required to complete Protecting God's Children training. Since we can't gather together for trainings, this requirement can be met through 'attending' two online trainings: VIRTUS online PGC Training and Massachusetts online Mandated Reporter Training.

Once registration is complete you will be directed to an online PGC training through VIRTUS. Upon completion of that training, individuals will be directed to a link to an additional online training on mandated reporting in Massachusetts. Both online trainings must be completed to be in compliance with child protection requirements.

It can be interesting, looking back over our lives, to try and see how we have gotten to where we are. Our life's journey can take many twists and turns that impact how we come to see ourselves, and understand the life we are called to live and how we are called to live it. For me, this brings to mind my own vocation. I was ten years old when I first thought of becoming a priest, and it was a desire that never really left me. Over the years, as I struggled to understand the meaning of this call, I was sure of only one thing—that God had a plan for my life.

As a teenager it was sometimes hard to talk about my vocation because when I told people that I was thinking about being a priest, they inevitably started to treat me differently. I was not always sure how to handle their responses, and yet I could not deny that I truly felt a calling from the Lord. So, I would just keep my feelings to myself. When I went off to Boston College, a friend I met there, after knowing me for about six months, asked me if I ever considered becoming a priest. I was honest with her, and thatcreated a chance for me to talk about this calling from the Lord. Her friendship turned out to be a big catalyst for me, to further discern exactly what the Lord wanted me to do.

After I graduated from BC and worked at Digital for five years, I could no longer deny what had become so clear to me. The Lord was calling me to the priesthood. I was happy in my life and yet I knew something was missing: what was missing was the life that the Lord was now calling me to. In my discernment of the priesthood, there was one truth I had to face before I could give myself completely over to this calling from the Lord. I had to realize that I had been asking the wrong question most of my life, which was "What do I want to do?". The right question was "What is God calling me to do?" I could only truly discern my calling when I finally understood that my opinion on this matter was wholly and completely irrelevant. God really did not care about what I thought I wanted to do. God was only concerned with my coming to understand what He wanted me to do. That is at the heart of all vocations. A vocation is a calling, and the only question we really need to ask is "What is God's will for my life?" Then we need to work on discerning the answer and seeking the strength to live it out.

As I look back over the years, I must say that I was very fortunate that my family was always supportive of my calling, particularly my Mom. I know in a lot of cases that is not true. Many families actually work actively

against vocations, trying to discourage them. I have witnessed that over my years as a priest. I remember speaking to one mom about her son who wanted to become a priest. He came to her one day and said that he really thought he might want to be a priest. Her reaction was to discourage him from thinking about it. This was a woman who went to daily Mass, and it was clear by how she lived her life that her faith and the Church were very important to her. I asked her why she would try to discourage her son. She responded that she was afraid he would be lonely. I replied, "There are many people who are lonely in marriage." Her response was, "I never thought about it that way—and you are right!" Loneliness is not about if you are in relationship with people, but *how* you are in relationship with them. In over twenty-five years as a priest, I really have never felt lonely. That arises out of having good, solid and healthy relationships with different people. But the reality is that there are many people out there—both family and friends—who actively work to discourage vocations, for the wrong reasons and with a lot of misunderstanding.

We all have a role in supporting vocations and helping them grow. It is about helping the person to come to terms with what God wants him or her to do in their life. It is about putting aside our own preconceived notions about what makes people happy, or not, and what we might believe is necessary in life.

I must say that I am truly happy in my life as a priest. It has been an incredible blessing in my life. The Lord has opened up to me so many amazing opportunities that would not have been possible if I had chosen *not* to listen to his will in my life. There cannot be a greater sense of peace or joy in life than coming to know what the Lord is calling us to do, and then to answer his call by doing just that.

As a Church we need more shepherds to care for the flock of Christ, and therefore I ask everyone to begin to pray for vocations—daily! But, for vocations to grow we need to grow into an attitude of vocations. Next week I would like to talk about the meaning of vocations in general.

# From our Director of Faith Formation Heather Hannaway

#### I Can't See Where I'm Going Here

How do you follow when you can't see that He's leading you? Or even that He's with you?

I know a lot of you may be frightened and uncertain with all that is happening during these unprecedented times. I know you wonder why God has allowed it, when He will deliver you, how He could possibly work this mess for good.

Those questions are natural, but maybe not the exact questions to ask. When I'm lost or uncertain, I have learned that the question is not "When?," or "How?," or even "Why?" The question is "Who?"

Who is this God we worship? If He is just a puppet master or a strategist, messing with our lives with no regard for our hearts, we owe Him neither trust nor love.

But if He is the God who is love; the God who humbled Himself to become one of us; the God who allowed Himself to be beaten, stripped, and nailed to a cross to die—and then rise again—on the off chance that you'd love him back; we have to learn to say, "The God who loves me is at work in this. I don't know what He's doing. I don't know why, but I know that I am not alone."

There's nothing wrong with wanting to see where God is in your suffering and uncertainty or wondering when there will be a reprieve. The danger is when you're seeking those answers because you don't trust that God is who He said He is—the Lord and Lover of your soul.

When people are suffering, I don't often have answers. But I often can begin to see the way their pain is working to make them holier—ultimately. But in the moment, it doesn't feel like enough. And so I find myself saying, "I don't know. I don't know what God's doing, but I know who He is. I know that He's with you. I know that He loves you more than you can imagine. I know that there's nothing He wouldn't do for you. And so, I have to trust not in what I can see and understand, but in who I know Him to be. He is yours and you are his. There is nothing to fear."

As you struggle to follow Him through whatever situation is trying your soul right now, take this to prayer: Who is God? What has He done in the past to reveal His power, His mercy, His love? What has He done in salvation history and what has He done in my life?

## FROM OUR SENIOR PRIEST IN RESIDENCE Fr. Colletti

In the Old Testament, the chosen people knew that their God was near to them.

"For what other nation, great or small, has God among them, as the Lord, our God is here among us whenever we call upon Him?" -Deuteronomy 4:7

In the New Testament, God is seen not merely close to us, but within us. Jesus prayed at the Last Supper...

Brother Lawrence (d.1691) wrote a book called <u>The Practice of the Presence of God</u>. A member of the Discalced Carmelites in Paris, he had always been governed by love, without selfish views, resolved to make the love of God the end of all his actions. He wrote...

"That in order to form a habit of conversing with God continually, and referring all we do to Him; we must at first apply to Him with some diligence: but that after a little care we should find His love inwardly excite us to it without any difficulty."

Practicing the presence of God is a spiritual exercise that challenges us to remain focused on God during our everyday activities. Lawrence further wrote:

"I began to live as if there were no one save God and me in the world."

Together, God and Lawrence cooked meals, ran errands, and scrubbed pots. He learned how to be attentive to God's close presence.

Jesus was, and is, our example of what it looks like to practice the presence of God in this harsh world. It is because of Jesus that we have the unbelievable privilege of being with God. Jesus shows us what it looks like to constantly be practicing the presence of God, for this is where Jesus' strength comes from.

"For in him we live and have our being." -Acts 7:28

We have found a ministry leader—a Master Gardener, to be exact—who has


volunteered her talents in the building of a team of individuals
