




A BOOK DISCUSSION!

St. John parishioner Tim Fitzgerald lost his sister to ALS—Lou Gehrig's disease—this past Good Friday, after being diagnosed only 6 months prior. Patricia was 'mom' to 5 boys, and in 2003, when her oldest was 16, she decided to go back to college to get a degree in social work, which she obtained and fully utilized. As part of a project, the following poem was penned by her, in honor of her 'five ducklings.' Tim shared this with us following her recent passing, and we thought it a perfect 'share' as we celebrate Mother's Day!

I had five little ducks all in a row. Wanted a damsel, next thing I know a pond full of mallards, none other than bro'. The eldest of fowl has his head on straight; May be referred to as little man Tate. Number two duckling, his given name Andrew. Some would say he has not a clue. The next little bird in the midst of the flock, great sense of humor, thinks life's a crock. Fourth of the fowl takes after the swan stubborn as she, will go on and on... Wee small ducklings, as cute as can be, Number five in the lineup, "You don't mess with me." Each day an adventure you just never know, they splish-splash around, amazing to watch them grow. All have feathers of different color and size. No pattern's been followed, one would surmise. As the breeder of fowl, I could be called Mother Goose. Some ask me "How?" They assume a screw loose. I nurse them, I groom them, I teach the life lessons. A challenge in fact is dealing with pubescence. Little pond to watch over, growing into a lake, space to spread their wings open keep growing, Goodness Sake! As they venture out into waters unknown, I worry in fact until they swim their way home. Since the first egg was hatched and I heard the first peep, It has been many moons of uneasy nights sleep. My feathers turn grey as I worry nonetheless. I hope and I ponder; I only want best. In the nest there are moments they act like wild geese. I ruffle my feathers and demand they bring peace. Elder birds squawk, "I'll miss this some days," Hard to imagine thoughts to fill down pillowcase. One day all my ducklings will be on their own. Their wings just keep growing until to be flown. Must prepare myself for each of their flights. Hope each strong enough to reach destined heights. The real fear should be when flight brings them back. That's when Mother Goose will have the last quack.

A couple of weeks ago, I mentioned that when I was in kindergarten my Mom returned to school to get her master's in education. She had decided that she was going to enter the world of teaching. The

interesting thing about her decision was that when Mom was in college, she decided that she would never teach. When she graduated from Emmanuel, she could have received her teaching certificate but chose not to. She just knew that teaching was something she would never do. Well, fast forward many years and the situation changed. Until I came along, my Mom always worked but usually at night. Now my parents discussed what would make the most sense for her when I went to school. My Dad recommended she consider teaching. At first she was opposed to the idea, but Dad pointed out the fact that she already did a lot of teaching. My parents never had to pay for baby sisters because my Mom would tutor them in payment. In time she realized that it might actually be a good thing for her to try teaching. And, well, let's just say she found her natural calling. At almost 89 years old she is still teaching.

Discovering who we really are, and what we are called to do, is not always easy. Many times, we have preconceived notions that determine how we decide to live out our lives. But, the truth and reality are that only One really knows what direction our lives should take—GOD! We spend our lives spinning our wheels, trying to discern the path we should take. We generally ask the wrong questions and look for the wrong answers; we already think we know the answers, and so we do not bother to ask the Lord for his help. Or, if we do, we fail to listen to what He is telling us. If we are honest, we must admit that it is usually because we do not like the direction He is sending us in. It is the syndrome that we know better than God about what will fulfill us and make us happy.

The only way to truly understand our purpose in life is to first recognize that we don't have the answers and cannot get the answers separate from God. The next step is to also realize that we probably do not even know the right questions to ask. The reality is that people have a tendency to make life all about themselves and their own perceived notions of what is best for them. And they are usually wrong! This is a hard concept in our current culture where it is necessary for the individual *alone* to define their own concept of truth. Life is determined through the individual's perception of how they feel and what they believe is the basis for how they must make decisions. We do not have a right to tell another that

their perception of truth is wrong. To tell another they are wrong is being judgmental and aggressive.

The problem with all of that is simple—truth is objective, universal, and unchangeable. Telling someone that the choices they are making are wrong is *not* an act of judgement against the person. It is about choices: actions taken or words spoken. And, as Christians we are required to stand up for the truth. The truth is not a set of ideas, feelings, concepts, or whatever. The truth cannot be determined by an individual. The truth is a person. The truth is Jesus Christ. And the way of being open to, understanding, and living out the truth is only possible through a real relationship with Jesus. Jesus made it very clear when He said, "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

In a world that rejects objective reality and truth, this is a very difficult teaching. We come across as being insensitive, judgmental, closed-minded, out of touch, and many other things. But what we know and believe about Christ does not leave truth up for discussion. There is one truth, one faith, one reality, and that is Christ. All that disagrees with the teachings of Christ is simply wrong. And Christ teaches us far more than love of God and love of neighbor and the golden rule. Following Christ means taking up the cross. It means rejecting our own sense of truth and our perceptions of who we are and what will make us happy.

Only by embracing Christ can a person truly discover who they are. When we are open to a real relationship with Christ, we discover our true talents and what will bring us the greatest happiness. The truth and reality are that we must seek to live out what Saint Paul said of himself, "It is no longer I who live but Christ who lives in me."

The season we are currently celebrating is about helping us to do just that. We might **think** we know what our lives are about, but Christ **knows** what our lives are about. Let us discover the truth—let us be open to Christ!




4TH ANNUAL HAIL MARY CHALLENGE

From our Genior Priest

Fr. Arnold Colletti

When I first got out of Saint John's Seminary on February 2, 1962, I thought I was going to save the world. I was With eight years intellectual training and the laying-on of the bishop's hands, I was equipped to save the world. However, I wasn't too long at Saint Theresa's Parish in Billerica when I came to realize I would not save the world—I would have to be content to save just Billerica. I had come to realize my human weaknesses and limitations.

Later on, at Our Lady of Fatima in Sudbury, I had mellowed and limited myself to saving only those people God would send into my life for saving.

At Sacred Heart and Saint Brigid in Lexington, I really narrowed my scope—I would save myself.

Now, I realize that I don't save anybody. We already have a Savior in Christ Jesus. He does the saving... and he works through so many channels. He is there in private prayer, communal prayer, especially in the Sacraments, but most especially he is in the Church—his people. In the 59 years I have ministered to many people, more people have ministered to me. I have always been outdone in generosity and goodness. All those people have been a great grace to me. All have been a source of God's presence.

Now that I am retired and in the Chelmsford Collaborative I relax more and enjoy more. I don't have to be a savior. I don't have to have all the answers. I don't have to be the brightest, the holiest, the hardest-working Christian in the parishes. We are all in this together. I cannot go to God alone and I never find God alone. As we walk together, work together, pray together, open our hearts to each other, we will be saved by God for Himself through Christ, Our Lord.

To all of you along the long 59 years, thank you—you have been my salvation.
