





Right now I am in the midst of doing confirmation interviews. These interviews consist of meeting each candidate for confirmation for 15 minutes. The interviews are not intended to be a test for the kids to determine

whether or not they can be confirmed. Rather, they're an opportunity for me to simply discern where they are in their faith journey. It is always interesting to hear the answers they give to the questions I ask. I am truly fascinated by how they understand the faith and how they see themselves being called to live out that faith.

There are two questions that I really consider to be most important of all my questions. In the lead-up to the first question, I talk to them about our image or perception of God when we are young. We have an image of an old man sitting on a throne with a long white beard and angels flapping all around Him. As we get older, hopefully, our perception of God changes. So, now, for the first question—a hard one: "Who is God for you now?" This question is followed by the second one: "In your whole life, has there been a moment when you experienced God—when you sensed his presence and knew God was there for you?"

I believe these are intrinsic questions for understanding how we relate to God and how we recognize the presence of God in our lives. And they are questions that all of us need to ask ourselves. It is so easy to simply take our faith life for granted. And it is so easy to simply live our lives without having any real thought of how our faith shapes the life we are living. As I often say, I believe many Christians, unintentionally, live their lives as functional atheists. It is *not* that they do not believe because they do. It is *not* that faith at some level is not important to them because it is. The problem is that they do not take the proper time to examine their choices in light of their faith.

The biggest reason this situation exists is because people are not exploring just who God is for them. Many times we remain at a child-like level of understanding who God is, or we develop a sense of God that is not concrete or cohesive. In these situations, it is hard for us to recognize the reality of the presence of God in our lives. As such, we simply live our lives without any real relation to our faith or to God. And many people will tell me that they do not sense or see God in their lives. When that happens, the person is simply not paying attention, or has never learned to pay attention, to God's presence. God is *always* present to us and is *always* communicating with us. If we do not see God in our lives or hear Him, the issue is *not* with God but with us.

The life of faith we are called to is not simply a life of rules. Yes, there are rules in our relationship with God for the simple reason that there are no relationships that do not have rules to them. But the rules are not what the relationship is about: they are our way of living out that relationship. But to discover the heart of a relationship, it is ultimately about getting to know the one we are in relationship with. It is about our perception of the other. So, we need to really ask ourselves, who do we think God is? Only then can we begin to understand our relationship with Him. Only when we understand who God is for us, can we begin to explore how we will recognize Him in our lives.

Jesus, of course, came in order to save us from our sins. We are sinners and we need God's grace and mercy to reject sin and live a life that is truly human. But Jesus also came in order to help us begin to understand who God truly is for us. He came so that we could begin to truly answer my first question—who is God for you? We discover who God is when we open up to who Christ really is. The fundamental truth of our faith is that Jesus is 100% human—just like us—and 100% God (called the hypostatic union or the act of the incarnation). God united himself to us in the person of Jesus Christ who alone has two natures, and those natures are completely separate. We discover truths about God in the way that Christ relates to us both in his humanity and in his divinity.

Jesus is our roadmap for understanding God, and we come to understand Christ through the Bible—both in the Old Testament and the New Testament. If we do not know the scriptures, we cannot know Christ. If we do not know Christ, we cannot know the Father. It all goes hand in hand.

Let us seek to understand our concept of who God is, and then place that up against what Christ has taught us. Then we can begin to unpack the meaning of our relationship with God. Once we understand our relationship with God as Christ taught us, we can begin to recognize the real presence of God in our lives.

### The Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit

-The Gifts that keep on Giving

This Sunday, Bishop Hennessey will extend his hand over 63 of our youth (their names can be found on page 5) and invoke a special outpouring of the Holy Spirit...

All-powerful God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, by water and the Holy Spirit you freed your sons and daughters from sin and gave them new life.

Send Your Holy Spirit upon them to be their helper and guide. Give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence.

Fill them with the spirit of wonder and awe in Your presence. We ask this through Christ, our Lord.

Following this invocation, they will be anointed with Sacred Chrism, a perfumed oil consecrated by the Bishop during Holy Week at the Chrism Mass. This anointing signifies the 'mark' or spiritual 'seal' of the Holy Spirit:

"Be Sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit"

**WISDOM** allows us to understand things from God's point of view. It allows us to recognize truth and use it to glorify God by choosing Godly solutions to problems.

**UNDERSTANDING** allows us grasp, at least in a limited way, the very essence of the truths of the Catholic Faith. Through understanding, we gain a certainty about our beliefs.

**COUNSEL**, also known as RIGHT JUDGMENT, is the perfection of the cardinal virtue of prudence. Prudence can be practiced by anyone, but counsel is supernatural. Through this gift, we are able to judge how best to act almost by intuition. Because of this gift, we need not fear standing up for the truths of the Faith, because the Holy Spirit will guide us in defending those truths.

**FORTITUDE**, also known as COURAGE, allows us to move beyond fear to stand up for God and His truths. We are able to stand up for good against evil and are convicted to take a stand when the occasion arises.

**KNOWLEDGE** allows us to understand the meaning and purpose God has for us. It differs from wisdom in that it is an action, not just a desire to live up to the ways of God. It differs from understanding in that it is not just ability, it is a knowing.

**PIETY**, or REVERENCE, is the perfection of the virtue of religion. It takes our willingness beyond a sense of duty, to a desire to worship and serve Him out of love.

**FEAR OF THE LORD** puts God in proper perspective, and allows us to understand His greatness and awesomeness. We understand who we are and why we are here in relationship to God. We understand that everything we are is due to the wonder, love, grace, and perfection of God.
