#### Heavenly Hall of Fame February 3—Feast Day of St. Blaise



He was both a doctor and a bishop in Armenia or Turkey. One legend that is told about him is that wild animals came to him to treat their wounds. Another is that a small boy was choking on a fish bone and Blaise saved his life by saying a prayer and blessing him with candles crossed upon his throat. Thus, St. Blaise is the patron saint of people with diseases of the

throat. In honor of St. Blaise's feast day, we celebrated the blessing of the throats at all our Masses on the weekend of February 4th/5th. Two unlit candles are crossed over the throat as the priest/deacon says a prayer of blessing.

A few years ago, I was on vacation in Prague with Mark, a priest friend of mine. We decided to take a tour of the city, and right after we sat down on the bus a family came aboard. It was a grandmother, her daughter and

husband, and two grandchildren. I was seated in the very back of the bus behind Mark. The family was clearly hoping to sit together and the only place to do that was in the back seat where there were five seats. I offered to move so they could sit with each other and then I sat next to Mark. At this point all of us got to talking and remained together throughout the tour which lasted about two hours. At the end of the tour, the mother asked me what Mark and I did for work and my response was, "We are Catholic priests." At that the grandmother turned to her daughter and said, "See, I told vou." She then asked me if I would hear her confession. Her daughter said, "Mom, they are on vacation." I responded, "We are never on vacation from that." We then found an isolated spot that was quiet, and she went to confession.

I never asked what made her think we were priests, and now part of me will always wonder. But, to me, it brings up the question of how people perceive who we are. As I tell people, we are always in relationship with our perception of someone. What we all need to realize is that our perception of someone is not always reality. But it is "our reality" of the person. The truth is that as a priest, and particularly as a pastor, I am perceived in many different ways. I know that there are people who truly like me, and others who do not-at all. There are those who believe I am doing a good job, and there are those who think I am wrecking their parish. There are those who find me open and supportive, and those who find me unwelcoming and intimidating. There are those who find in me a way to move closer to Christ, and those who believe that I am a roadblock, I obviously could go on and on. The truth and reality is that a person's perception of me is based on many factors: how they hear what I say; their experience of our time together; even, honestly, their own history; and, of course, what they are hoping to accomplish through our interaction. There are, of course, other factors, but you get the point: someone's perception of me is not something I can control. And it is not my job to try to influence another person's perception. Rather, as a Christian, what I am called to do is simply come to discern the person God created me to be, and to seek to grow in that understanding. My focus can never be on what another's perception is: it must only be on God's knowledge of who I truly am.

If we look to the Gospels, we can see clearly that people had many different perceptions of who Jesus was. He even asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" And the answers He received went all over the place until He asked, "But who do you say that I am?" And Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." In response, Jesus was clear that this insight did not come from Peter alone, but that he able to see the truth of Jesus through the grace of God. Many people did not like Jesus. They did not like what He stood for. They did not like the challenges that He presented to them. They did not like how Jesus did not conform to the status quo: they sought to attack and belittle what He did. They cast aspersions upon how He could work miracles and what his motives were. But Jesus simply did not care about their perceptions of who He was or what He did. Jesus stayed focused on the only thing that mattered to Him, which was fulfilling the Father's will. He understood the person God was calling Him to be, and if people liked that and were drawn to Him-great! If they were not, He simply let them walk away.

Jesus had no illusions about where all this would lead Him. He made it clear that He would be crucified but that God would overcome and raise Him from the dead. He had confidence in God and trusted that the Father would always provide. It may not always have been what He wanted, but his response was always the same, "Not my will but yours."

We live in a world that cares usually more about perception than reality. As Christians we are called to look at life very differently. We must first realize that even our perception of ourself may be wrong. Each of us, through prayer, needs to seek *God's* understanding of us, which is never a perception—it is always reality. He has our instruction book and knows exactly who we are and who we can be. We have to be willing to let go of our own flawed sense of self in order to discover the person God created us to be. It is not about what we might want for ourselves; rather; it is about what God wants for us, which is always for our good.

Once we are truly open to discerning and growing into the person God has created us to be—and that is truly our focus—it will not matter what the perceptions of others may be. May we follow the example of Jesus and, like Him, truly grow in wisdom and understanding of ourselves by simply living out these words, "Not my will but yours."

Make Time to Remember the Sick and Caregivers

World Day of the Sick is observed each year on February 11<sup>th</sup>—a Marian feast day many know as celebrating Mary as Our Lady of Lourdes, and acclaiming the healing powers of the springs of water where Mary appeared to Bernadette.

In naming this day as World Day of the Sick, the Church calls our attention to the fact that sickness affects all of humanity, and calls upon all of humanity to respond with care and empathy. As followers of Christ, we know that Christ brings healing—physical and spiritual to those who ask for healing and to those whom others bring to him for healing.

Pope Francis reminds us that this day offers an opportunity to reflect on the experience of illness. Such reflection is appropriate and necessary because our culture and our busyness can lull us into ignoring the existence of sickness until it touches us personally or touches our family and friends. The papal message on this 31<sup>st</sup> World Day of the Sick is entitled: "Take care of him"—Compassion as a synodal exercise of healing. In light of the Church's synodal journey, Pope Francis invites "all of us to reflect on the fact that it is especially through the experience of vulnerability and illness that we can learn to walk together according to the style of God, which is closeness, compassion, and tenderness."

Pope Francis attests that care and empathy are demonstrated by focusing awareness and attention on the responsibility of being neighborly, living together as community, together building the Kingdom here on earth. "The parable (of the Good Samaritan) shows us how a community can be rebuilt by men and women who identify with the vulnerability of others, who reject the creation of a society of exclusion, and act instead as neighbors, lifting up and rehabilitating the fallen for the sake of the common good."

We are reminded that healthcare providers are also people who need "someone to take care of them." We are encouraged to recognize their service, defend their right to suitable working conditions, and to advocate for a limit on the number of patients that healthcare workers are expected to care for during their workday.

Let's pray that we become a community that truly walks together with compassion.

#### From our Parochial Vicar

Three gods or one God?

Dear family, we testify in our Creed on Sundays that we believe in "one God," yet in the same Creed we also profess that we believe in God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. What does it all mean? Which one is it? Do we have three gods? At the risk of confusing some of you, I think it will be profitable to attempt an explanation of this mystery, even if just a little.

First and foremost, we believe that God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit constitute the Holy Trinity. We know this through the scriptures. In other words, we know this because God has told us. If it were not due to God telling us, we would have never been able to know this on our own. This is such a great mystery that we cannot fully understand it. We need God to help us. However, God has given us a great capacity for intellect or reason, which we can make use of to understand this mystery better. Nevertheless, we can only get so far.

In order to understand this mystery, let us think about the Trinity in terms of relationships. Think for instance about your relationships to others. You are probably a sibling to some of your family members, a parent to your children, or a child to your parents. As an example, let us consider a hypothetical person named John. John is a brother, a father, and a son. He is John the brother, John the father, and John the son. Different relationships yet the same John. He has not changed but remains the same John—not different Johns.

In an analogous way, we have one God yet three persons or in this example, three relationships. The relationship of the Father to the Son; the relationship of the Son to the Father; and the relationship of the Father and the Son to the Holy Spirit. Three persons in one God. Each person is the same God, not different gods.

When we pray, we can pray to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The Father loves the Son. The Son is the beloved of the Father. And the Holy Spirit is Love itself: the love that exists between the Father and the Son. Are we praying to love like the Father—as it was in the beginning? To be loved like the Son—as it is now? Or to become love to others, like the Holy Spirit—as it shall always be?

## THE FORTY DAYS OF LENT

have one overriding purpose: to help the Christian Community prepare itself to celebrate the Sacred Triduum of Holy Thursday (Mass of the Lord's Supper), Good Friday (Celebration of the

Passion of Our Lord), Holy Saturday (The Easter Vigil) and Easter with mind and heart renewed.

Lent reminds us of our Baptism, which is based upon God's Holy Word, conferred through the gift of divine life. We are called to commit to live always with repentance and faith as members of God's Holy People. Although it necessarily directs attention to our sins and shortcomings, Lent ought to enliven our hope, and help us love God and neighbor more generously.

These uplifting purposes should govern our approach to all Lenten practices and observances. Penancesespecially the ancient trilogy of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving—address interior resistance and external obstacles to faith and charity, but only in order to bind us more closely to God and neighbor. Liturgical celebrations ought to promote our hearing of God's Word, recall key moments in the life and ministry of Jesus, and energize us to live as befits a people of faith.

In calling us once again to "repent and believe in the Gospel," Lent also places at our disposal the resources of the Church and its Tradition. Our Lenten schedule makes some of those resources more readily available. We hope that it will help you to find what you need to embrace this season with faith, gratitude, and hope.

### ABSTINENCE AND FASTING

ABSTINENCE: Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligations of abstinence. Abstinence (no meat) is to be observed on Ash Wednesday, Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

**FASTING:** Catholics over the age of 18 and up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent, are defined as the days of fasting. On these days, only 1 full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted; but liquids, including milk and fruit juices, are allowed.

THE SACRED PASCHAL FAST: The Paschal Fast should also be kept sacred. It is to be celebrated everywhere on the Friday of the Lord's Passion and, where appropriate, prolonged also through Holy Saturday as a way of coming, with spirit uplifted, to the joys of the Lord's Resurrection.

DISPENSATION FOR 2023: This year, the Feast of St. Patrick, the patron saint of our Archdiocese, falls on a Friday during Lent. Given the importance of this feast in the life of the Archdiocese and in the lives of many Catholics, Cardinal Sean is granting dispensation from the Friday Lenten abstinence on March 17, 2023, to those who wish to take advantage of this opportunity. This is a one day only dispensation.

### LENTEN ALMSGIVING

Our Collaborative Social Justice Committee has again, for its International Initiative, committed to support our Sister Parish, Our Lady Star of the

Sea, in Sierra Leone, West Africa.

During this Lenten Season, we will be conducting an Almsgiving collection to support this parish, which is deeply dedicated to serving its community through corporal and spiritual works of mercy. Your material and goods donations in years past have helped this community in a number of profound ways.

This year, you may donate via online giving, available through all of our churches. 
