Changes being Made in our... Post-Pandemic world!



With President Biden ending the US National Emergency in response to the COVID-19 Pandemic, come changes here in our community:

Beginning NEXT WEEKEND, April 29/30...

- Eucharistic Ministers will no longer be required to wear a mask when distributing Holy Communion.
- Eucharistic Ministers will no longer be required to sanitize their hands following the placement of Holy Communion on a person's tongue.
- The 'Mask-Only/ Social Distancing' areas will remain in all our churches, but in time, the size of these areas may change. For the immediate future, it will remain as is.

Also effective this same weekend... We will no longer be reciting the Act of Spiritual Communion as part of the Mass. The prayer can be found on the LIVEVIEW page of our website for those who watch Mass from home.



REMINDER OF **NEW PROCEDURE**

If you are someone who is unable to receive Holy Communion via the Communion line, this is a

reminder that you are no longer limited to sitting in the handicap row or the first few rows of the church. You are now able to sit anywhere, provided it is at the END of the pew of your choosina.

When the time comes for the distribution of Communion, two of our Eucharistic Ministers will walk among the congregation and bring Communion to anyone who raises his/her hand.

Being at the end of the pew allows the Eucharistic Minister to more easily get to you.

Our Prayerful Response...

As many of you may know, The Satanic Temple of Salem, MA is hosting their biggest convention yet—SatanCon 2023—at the Boston Marriot Copley Place the weekend of April 28-30. The event is sold out and it is being promoted as "a weekend of blasphemy and remembrance in Boston." It also celebrates The Satanic Temple's 10th anniversary.

Below, please find the monthly update of all our facilities. We will be publishing updates on the fourth Sunday of every month.

St. Mary The condition of the church exterior doors seem to worsen with each year that passes. Additionally, the width of the center door opening needs to be increased to make the carrying of caskets into the church easier. We are currently getting quotes from contractors to address the replacement of a total of 10 doors.

Due to the unapologetic effects of winter salting, the aluminum railings at the front entrance have suffered much deterioration. These will be replaced to match the new handicapped railing that were recently installed.

A catch basin, that is beginning to collapse, has formed in the parking lot that is located in between the church and parish center. This repair is in the process of being scheduled, before it becomes a safety issue.

The safety gate that stops traffic from cutting through the parking lot is aged and in need of repair. Stay tuned for a future update on how this will be addressed.

And... the lift project is on its last punch-list item! The phone line is not calling out, so we are reaching out to Verizon to get this solved.

St. Margaret

Again, the damage from winter salting has struck and has negatively impacted the integrity of the steel of the handicapped ramp. Although there is no immediate danger, we will be getting quotes in the near future to have this fixed.

The terracotta roof tiles that were damaged by the July 2021 lightning strike have been replaced. However, during construction, a section of irrigation line was crushed by the lift. The repair of this line is scheduled for April 25, followed by the turning on of the system for the spring/summer seasons.

We are experiencing some issues with the roof of St. John the main church, which will only get worse if not attended to. Quotes are currently being obtained.

Although the light poles in the parking lot are in good condition, the bases need maintenance, which will be addressed soon.

The Parish Center emergency exit staircase is also in need of repairs as the winter salt has taken a toll.



My two cats, Emerson and Berkley, can be rather funny with each other. One of them will be lying in bed with me and then the other one will come over and start washing him. Clearly the one washing is doing it just to

irritate the other one. After a short time, the one getting washed will inevitably start fighting. Then, they'll start wrestling with each other the way cats do when they're not *really* fighting.

The wrestling of my cats reminds me of the story of Jacob. "Jacob was left there alone. Then a man wrestled with him until the break of dawn. When the man saw that he could not prevail over him, he struck Jacob's hip at its socket so that Jacob's socket was dislocated as he wrestled with him. The man then said, "Let me go, for it is daybreak." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go until you bless me." "What is your name?" the man asked. He answered, "Jacob." Then the man said, "You shall no longer be named Jacob, but Israel, because you have contended with divine and human beings and have prevailed." Jacob then asked him, "Please tell me your name." He answered, "Why do you ask for my name?" With that, he blessed him. Jacob named the place Peniel, "because I have seen God face to face," he said, "yet my life has been spared."

Jacob was facing a difficult decision and as part of the transition, he came to wrestle with God. His new name is a sign of this struggle. Israel: the first part of the Hebrew name *Yisrael* is given a popular explanation in the word *saritha*, "you contended;" the second part is the first syllable of *'elohim*, "divine beings." The present incident, with a similar allusion to the name Israel, is referred to in <u>Hos 12:5</u>, where the mysterious wrestler is explicitly called an angel. (explanation taken from footnotes of USCCB)

In our lives we face many difficult moments and at times can feel irritated with God. When that happens, we can almost feel like God is poking us, and poking us until we start to push back. Then, like my cats and Jacob, we get into a wrestling match with God. This is not a bad thing when that happens. When my cats wrestle it is actually a sign of affection. In the story of Jacob there is a clear sense of intimacy in this wrestling. The contention that happens between Jacob and God is *not* a sign of disrespect, but one of trying to establish a deeper relationship.

How often I hear from people about their doubts of faith and how badly they feel about it. My response is almost always the same. Doubt is *not* a lack of faith. It is a faith seeking to understand more deeply. Apathy is a lack of faith: we are unsure and simply walk away. When we struggle with doubt, we are really, in a sense, wrestling with God. It is a sign of hope because we are not giving into the doubt, but are trying to understand whatever it is we are struggling with. We are being

called to delve deeper into our faith. We are called to wrestle with our perceptions of truth, and those presented by the Scriptures and the Church. It is a sign of maturity and a desire to have a more meaningful faith.

Peter, when he denied Jesus, could have followed Judas. Instead, he grieved over his sin and, then, when he heard the good news that Jesus lived, he pursued the truth. He did not hide from what he had done: he faced his sin and brokenness and confronted Jesus with hope and wonder. He failed Jesus in a real way, but his moment of doubt did not determine his relationship with Christ. I have no doubt that he struggled with how Jesus would receive him. He wrestled with how to approach the Lord. But ultimately his faith showed him the hope that initially brought him to Christ.

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." He said to him, "Feed my lambs." He then said to him a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." He said to him, "Tend my sheep." He said to him a third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was distressed that Jesus had asked him a third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to Him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." [Jesus] said to him, "Feed my sheep. Amen, amen, I say to you, when you were younger, you used to dress yourself and go where you wanted; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." He said this to signify by what kind of death Peter would glorify God. And when He had said this, He said to him, "Follow me."

Peter was dumbfounded by all that Jesus said. Do you love me? Must have been a tough question for him to hear. He had to wrestle with what Christ was calling him to do. Peter would eventually lay down his life for Christ. But that did not just happen in a moment. Rather, it was a journey, and Peter wrestled mightily with who God was calling him to be. But through that struggle he truly became Peter, the rock of faith upon which the Church was built.

May our journey lead us to that struggle. May we be open to wrestling with God, particularly when He annoys us—when our doubts seem to be at their greatest. We are *not* lost. Rather, it is then that God is wrestling with us to help us change our lives.

Next week we will be celebrating the 4th Sunday of Easter or what is known as Good Shepherd Sunday. The readings, psalms, hymns, and homilies will focus on Jesus in His role as our Good Shepherd. There are many biblical passages touching on the theme of sheep. Perhaps one of the more famous is the sorting of the sheep and the goats in Matthew. I have long struggled with this parable of Jesus'. I think this is a challenging gospel for many people. After all, when it comes to serving "the least of these," who couldn't do better? I certainly could and am uncomfortably reminded of this each and every time I encounter this particular passage.

However, this discomfort is not the main source of struggle for me with this passage. No, in truth I struggle with the sheep=good and goat=bad dichotomy. I have a great love for goats and am not particularly fond of sheep, and am definitely of the opinion that goats are the superior creature. So, I never liked that the goats were sent to damnation. This is obviously a little silly as livestock preferences are hardly the point of the parable. The point is that we are meant to see and serve Christ in others and that sin is both a matter of what we do AND what we do not do. Still, I want the goats to be able to go to Heaven. Knowing this, several years ago a friend sent me an article and accompanying icon of Jesus, the Good Goatherd. The article proposed that while of course we should strive to be sheep, to follow and serve the Good Shepherd, we shouldn't give up all hope for the goats: after all Jesus came to save sinners. Not one of us is perfectly serving the Lord at all times but that does not stop Christ from loving us or seeking us. He, as a different parable tells us, will seek out even a single lost sheep that has wandered away from the fold and carry it home on His shoulders. Presumably He will scoop up any goats wandering in the wilderness as well.

It should be noted that it is in the collecting of these wayward animals that the Lord and an ordinary shepherd part ways. The latter will return a stray to fold, whether it likes it or not, through force if necessary. However, the Lord will never force us into His flock. In order to be saved, we must first submit to the Shepherd; we must do as He asks of us. For a day will come, when whether or not we have chosen to follow Him, that will have eternal consequences. It is this day that is shown in the parable of the sorting of the sheep and the goats; judgment day has arrived and the choice to serve or scorn the Lord cannot be undone. None of us know when this day will come, so we would do well to stay with our Shepherd at all times. For He has vowed to bring us home safely, if we allow Him.

Whatever Happened to Joy?

Someone has said that joy means "pleasure, delight, exhilaration of spirit, excitement caused by hope. Rejoice means joy in the highest degree—to be intensely glad. Happiness means fully content—to have extensive pleasure."

How many Christians do you know today who are exhilarated, excited, intensely glad, fully content, experiencing joy in the highest degree? Everywhere there are problems. Health problems, concerns about business, houses, jobs, education, the pandemic, global warming, and all conspiring to rob the people of God of their confidence in the Lord, and their joy and gladness. If you can simply trust God, believing he knows exactly what is happening and that he will bring glory out of it all, then joy returns.

This drying up of joy and gladness in believers is evident everywhere you look today. So many of God's people look sad and defeated, because they have lost the joy of the Lord. Many Christians seem just as lonely, blue and fearful as the unbeliever. It has become a disgraceful testimony to the world, and it is high time every Christian asked himself: Is there enough joy in my soul to overflow in my actions and my conversations, or have I become a murmurer and complainer?

How many times did the scriptures teach us about joy? One third of all the psalms speak of joy. Have we forgotten the promises Christ made to us: "I've come to share my joy?" No matter what happens we are under the protective wings of our God. "Because you have been my help, therefore in the shadow of your wings I will rejoice." (Psalm 63). No wonder Paul could say, "I am exceedingly joyful in all my tribulations" (2 Corinthians 7). How can anyone under God's protective wings allow their joy and gladness to wither? It is an insult to God's faithfulness.

One of the gifts of the Holy Spirit is joy; that is why the Spirit of God is calling us to renew the joy of our salvation.
