Fr. Colletti has a habit of making off-handed statements during his homilies that stick with me. I recall one homily when he said, "if Catholics really believed in the presence of Christ in the Eucharist, they'd be lined up around the block every Sunday." And he's right. The Eucharist is a gift from God to the Church; the True Presence of Christ, shared with us every Sunday. Why aren't Catholics lined up around the block?

A couple weeks ago, I was doing some reading about Corpus Christi celebrations around the world and I read about processions of the Eucharist displayed in a monstrance, sometimes miles long, followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Wow, that sounds amazing! I was excited by the idea, but didn't think we could do it justice with the short time we have for planning it. Still, I wanted to find a way to celebrate Corpus Christi and I thought of how moving my recent experiences have been in Eucharistic Adoration, so I suggested to Fr. Brian that we hold a Holy Hour. Fr. Fernando, who told me he misses the Corpus Christi processions in his home country of El Salvador, graciously agreed to be the celebrant.



I'd like to invite all of you to join Fr. Fernando and I at a Holy Hour on the Feast of Corpus Christi; the day the Church sets aside to celebrate the True Presence of Christ.

Fr. Fernando will lead us in prayer, I will be there to sing songs with you, and together we can all celebrate the

Eucharist as a community. You can bring your Bible and your Rosary in case inspiration strikes, or just bring yourself to spend an hour in the True Presence of Christ. I hope you'll join us.



I apologize if some of this letter is redundant, however, we would like to reach out to our wide network of kind and concerned friends in order not to leave anyone out from this endeavor. We know many people would like to help, if only they were informed!

We have been in contact with this family since March, getting to know them, their experiences and their needs, introducing them to details of our lives here, filing paperwork, and preparing for their arrival -- by improving a private area of our house, and building networks to assist with needs. We didn't do this alone. Many friends have volunteered their skills and experience to help us, and many others also donated both materials and funds for the family's initial transition here.

After a lot of preparation, the family is arriving this week: on Thursday, June 1st. As you can imagine we are both excited and anxious about the many unknowns. However, in every step of the way, small moments have confirmed to us again and again of God's Providence and guidance in this endeavor. We honestly feel very grateful for having this Ukrainian family in our lives -- at this point, they may be edifying and enriching us more than we are them! But that is the beautiful thing about reciprocity in supporting others: it's never a one-way street. Mother Teresa put the relationship this way: "Charity isn't about pity; it's about love."

Again, we invite you to be involved. Here are some ways that you can help:

- 1. Prayer! No matter what good we hope to do, nothing of lasting value can be achieved without prayer. You can help a lot by keeping us all lifted up daily in prayer. Thank you!!
- 2. Reach out to Marianne if you have other skills that could be useful. For example, if you have pandemic experience working over Zoom, you can still help if you are a teacher of ESOL or have expertise in Immigration Law.

From July 16-21, a group of 11 teens, 4 adult chaperones and 2 priests from the Collaborative will be heading to New Jersey to serve the less fortunate in the name of Jesus, while deepening their Christ connection to through daily Mass, Adoration, and Christ-centered fun! This weekend, June 3rd/4th, some of these youth will be speaking at each of our Masses. One of the things they will address is our annual CHWC Fundraising Campaign: Tools4Teens! Below is a full explanation of how this fundraiser works.

Over the last several months, we have worked together as a community to devise a new weekend Mass schedule. We are doing this to be proactive for future needs. Our current weekend Mass schedule—ten Masses between our three communities—is workable based on the clergy support we currently have. The



reality is that in a few years that clergy support will not be available and as such we need to prepare for what will be feasible for two priests to handle. We must also realize that in the current situation we have 15 daily Masses—three per weekday at each church— two nursing home Masses, and an average of five funeral Masses each week. Add Sunday celebrations to this and we are averaging 32 Masses a week! Obviously, this is not something that is sustainable with just two priests. That is why we began the process of looking at what a new weekend Mass schedule would need to look like.

The parish council started with devising a survey to collect information on what our communities deemed as important issues that should impact the decisions needed for crafting the new schedule. After analyzing what over 600 people had to say we put forth what seemed the most optimal schedule. The idea was that there would be only six Masses on the weekend, with each parish celebrating two. We also felt it was important to have a Sunday evening Mass and at least one Sunday morning Mass for each parish. It was also determined that we could not have two Masses at the same time and that Masses would need to be at least ninety minutes apart. The reason for this is that the schedule needs to be set up in such a way that a single priest can cover all the Masses over a weekend. Even when we have two priests there will be weekends where only one priest will be available, i.e., vacation time or illness. Based on your feedback and these facts, the parish council assigned the times for the new schedule; this was then sent back out to the community, in the form of another survey, for your further input.

After hearing from over 600 people again the parish council worked together to assign these particular times to the particular churches. The decision was made that in assigning the Mass times certain criteria would be followed:

- each church would get one and only one of the following Masses: 4 pm on Saturday, 9:30 am on Sunday and 11 am on Sunday
- each church would get one Sunday morning Mass

The schedule we are proposing—which can be found within the survey—is one that we believe is the fairest one to meet the needs of the Collaborative. We all must recognize that people will not be happy about losing "their" Mass. The Mass you go to is not simply about the attendance at Mass, but it is about being part of a community. Changing Mass times creates a deep emotional turmoil for many people. However, even with all that being true, the situation we are moving towards is an inevitable reality. While we are not in a time of pressing need at the current moment, be assured that it is coming.

It is also important to understand that what we are presenting in this last part of the conversation on a new weekend Mass schedule is not going to be implemented immediately. The earliest that it should happen would be June 1, 2024. In January we will look at the clergy support to see if the current schedule remains feasible and if it does, we will continue with it.

We all must also realize that clergy support is something that could change quickly and dramatically. In November and December, two of our assisting clergy stopped serving here based on their own personal issues. Although the hope is that we can transition to a new schedule in a seamless way, we recognize that it may not be possible, but that is what we are planning for at this time.

We hope that as you look at this final proposal that your responses will be done in a Christian way. We cannot look simply at what is best for an individual person or community. We are all brothers and sisters in Christ and are called to work together to build up the Body of Christ.

Thank you for your input on this important conversation in our communities.

A couple of years ago during the pandemic, I walked into Paul Firicano's office and he handed me a sheet of paper he was holding. It was a letter from the Massachusetts unemployment office asking for more

information on my claim for unemployment benefits. Obviously, I was not unemployed, and so we immediately got in touch with the appropriate person to find out what was going on. They informed us that someone was using my social security number to apply for benefits. After we confirmed that this was a fraudulent claim, they told me what I needed to do. One of the things I needed to do was freeze my credit reports, to prevent someone from taking out credit cards or getting loans in my name. I immediately did that. I got in touch with each reporting agency, and they helped me get it all set up. The only time this would be an issue is when I may need to do those things, but it really is not that hard to unblock and re-block my reports.

After dealing with all the nuisances this created, I remember the feeling of being violated in a sense. It was obviously not to the level of what people encounter from real trauma, but it still felt like a piece of me was taken away. Of course I got over it, but it was still pretty unsettling. Someone got hold of a piece of my identity and was using it fraudulently, and that could have caused me real headaches moving forward.

As I reflect on this scary moment in my life, it calls to mind a really important question: what makes up a person's identity? This has become an important cultural question. We use the word 'identity' in a lot of different ways in our society. We have, of course, our financial identity which can be put at risk so easily in this day and age. I would call that simply a practical identity. It does not really determine who we are; it simply helps us to communicate certain information in a convenient way. We have other identities, such as those we use on social media, but what many people present on social media is not really a true snapshot of themselves. Rather, it is something they create in order to present to people how they want to be perceived, but that still does not truly identify who they are.

The real question that most of us need to ask is: how do we get at the heart of what it means to be me? The world has a lot of answers to this question, but in general the path put forth by the world tends to center around the person creating their own truth about who they are. The world believes that people should be able to self-identify, and we must of course accept this 'truth' as being valid. We are called to affirm people and accept whatever personal truth they create for how they choose to experience life.

As Christians this is *not* how we are called to discover the truth about ourselves. Truth is not subjective, nor

is it changeable or fluid. There is One, and One alone, who knows the truth of who we are and it is *not* ourselves. Human beings are very good at lying to themselves and that is called self-deception. There are many factors that can create this self-deception but ultimately it lies in sin. If we want to discover the true nature of who we are, we need only turn to God. The truth can only be known when we are in proper relationship with Jesus, who told us He is the way and the truth and the life. He also was clear that He is the *only* way to the Father.

Human beings are created to be in union with God. That is at the essence of what it means to be human. When we deny this truth and start to create an identity apart from our relationship with Christ, we are creating a fraudulent identity. Our true nature is only revealed when Christ is the foundation of our entire life. Christ and Mary are the only human beings who lived a fully human life. Mary did it by living her life centered in Christ. Christ did it by living his life centered in the will of the Father. Mary showed us what we need to do to discern the meaning and purpose of our life. When the angel came to Mary, she spoke those powerful words, "I am the handmaid of the Lord, let it be done to me according to your word." And as she watched over Jesus and all that occurred during his childhood years, she pondered over them and treasured them. She gave the best possible advice at the wedding of Cana: "Do whatever He tells you." She stood at the foot of the cross to be with Christ in his suffering and to unite herself with his suffering. She was with the Apostles in the upper room afterward where they gathered in prayer.

Mary gives us direction about how to discover our true identity. It begins by saying 'yes' to God and accepting Christ as our Lord and Savior. We then need to ponder all that Christ has done and follow his example. We must always be ready to say 'yes' to whatever Jesus calls us to do. And, of course, at the heart of the Christian life is taking up our cross daily and following Christ. Like Mary, we must unite ourselves with Christ on the cross. It is only by dying to ourselves that we can experience the reality of the resurrection. All this is grounded in a prayer life that is united with the people of God.

It is not possible to truly know ourselves apart from Christ. May we seek to follow the example of Mary and come to be the person God created us to be, which is our true identity.

Make Time to Value what is Within - Interiority

"People set out to wonder at the heights of the mountains, at the mighty waves of the sea, at the broad waterfalls of the rivers, at the vast extent of the oceans, at the movements of the stars. But themselves they pass by." -St. Augustine, *Confessions*

Interiority is a term familiar to those actively seeking to develop an awareness of their need for inner focus on the awesome gift of God in their own person—the desire to find and be in one's center, to be in touch with one's inner stillness and peace. This is an experience of contemplation that some spiritual writers name as an encounter with the *Other* in whom we find a true unity with ourselves, and therefore with all others.

"You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you." -St. Augustine, *Confessions*

So much is felt deeply and pulsed through our beings by the human heart! Openness and conversion of the heart are calls echoed in both the Hebrew and Christian Scriptures. We are continually reminded that living Christianity is something that comes from within—a call from within which impels expression in how we choose to live.

Augustine tells us clearly that when looking into our hearts for knowledge of who we are, we must be honest and listen to what God wants to reveal to us. Self-knowledge has to be learned by oneself, but one cannot learn it without listening to the *Other* and some "others" who are blessed to be companions on the journey.

To develop *Interiority*, make time:

- to find space in our day for solitude -be alone and undisturbed.
- for silence
 quiet the sounds around us and within us.
- to be at peace -touch your inner center, a place where you are still.

We experience the presence of God in our being. Let us pray for one another that the Spirit, sent by the God who knows us and loves us, will prompt us to see what is within and not pass by the wonder of who we are.

Wholeheartedness

When a lawyer came up to Jesus and asked: "which is the most important commandment in the law of Moses," Jesus replied, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, and mind. This is the first and the greatest commandment. The second most important is similar love your neighbor as much as you love yourself." (Matthew 22:37, Mark 12:30, and Luke 10:27.)

Have you ever loved anything or anyone wholeheartedly? Perhaps when we first fell in love but then life goes on and we are taken up with many distractions.

Some people I know who are wholehearted are alcoholics and drug addicts. They spend their whole time thinking about these things. They risk their life and the lives of others in order to obtain the next "new hit." But I have also met priests, religious, parents and individuals who are wholehearted. These are my heroes.

Sometimes we are more like the people of Ephesus. John, in the Book of Revelation, is asked to write a letter to the leader of the Church at Ephesus and tell him this: "I write to inform you of a message from him who walks among the churches and holds their leaders in his right hand. He says to you, I know how many good things you are doing. I have watched hard work vour and vour patience. I know you don't tolerate sin among your members, and you have carefully examined the claims of those who say they are apostles but are not. You have found out how they lie. You have patiently suffered for me without quitting."

"Yet there is one thing wrong. You don't love me as you once did, but you have become lukewarm and I vomit you out of my mouth. Think about those times of your first love—how different now. Turn back to me again and work as you did before, or else I will come and remove your candlestick from its place among the churches." (Revelation 2).
