

2024 Mass Intentions

The partial 2024 Mass Intention Calendar opens THIS MONDAY, July 10 at 9 am. We are only able to schedule intentions for the time period of January 1 - May 31, 2024, as we anticipate the potential

June 2024 change in Mass Schedule. You can contact the parish offices during regular business hours at (978) 256-2374. Mass intentions cannot be requested via voicemail or email message.

A donation of \$10 per intention is suggested to be made at the time that you schedule your intention, and it/they will be published in the bulletin if scheduled with enough advance notice to meet the bulletin submittal deadline.

THE BELOW GUIDELINES APPLY TO MULTIPLE MASS WEEKENDS, which are earmarked for the first weekend (Friday through Sunday) of every month. If your intention request falls within this timeframe, we ask that you please familiarize yourself with the following guidelines before calling to schedule:

- Up to 10 intentions will be scheduled per each of the following Masses...
 - ◆ Friday 7 am St. Mary; 8 am St. Margaret of Scotland; and
 9 am St. John the Evangelist daily Masses
 - ◆ Saturday 4 pm and Sunday 11 am St. Mary Masses

 - ◆ Saturday 4 pm and Sunday 10 am St. Margaret of Scotland weekend Masses
- There is no stipend required for these Mass intentions

Last week we saw that 'praying through scripture' is one way to establish a prayer life. The use of scripture in prayer is ancient. And when we use scripture we do not have to guess whether we are hearing God, because the Bible is

God's very word proclaimed to us. The power of the scriptures is grounded in the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit ensured that the scriptures would never contain an error when it comes to faith and morals. The Holy Spirit gives us the insight to understand the wisdom contained in the scriptures. Last week we focused on a simple way to meditate on God's word through scripture. But, in a prayer life there are many different ways to make use of the Bible.

When we want to develop a relationship, one of the most important elements is coming to know the person with whom we desire to have a relationship. God understands our need to know Him. We were created to be in relationship with God, and so we are only truly grounded when we have a real relationship with Him. Like all others, that relationship is built upon trust, fidelity, mutuality, and real communication.

Once humanity wrecked our relationship with God, God decided to fix it. He had a plan for how our salvation would work. It took time, for God wanted to prepare the way for our salvation. He helped us experience the truth of salvation through being on a journey—a journey that needed a roadmap. God knew that we could not achieve salvation on our own; in fact we can never achieve salvation. So, the Father sent Jesus to do that for us.

Many people have their own ideas about who Christ is. And quite frankly, many of their ideas are simply wrong. They try to box Jesus into a nice, neat little package so that they can live their lives without really being challenged. Yet, that is why Christ came. He came to challenge us and help us find that roadmap. Basically, Jesus is the roadmap because He is the only way to salvation. If we want to learn how to read the roadmap, we need to understand how the roadmap works. We can only discover that through a real relationship with Christ. And we can only have a real relationship with Christ when we make use of the scriptures. As Saint Jerome wrote, "Ignorance of scripture is ignorance of Christ."

Last week we presented a simple way of meditating on the scriptures; this week I would like to take a slightly different track. Saint Ignatius of Loyola developed this method as he came into a real relationship with Christ. He believed in using our imagination to place us into the scripture stories. The use of imagination can make some people uncomfortable, but it is a powerful way to make the Gospel stories come more alive for us. I would like to propose the following steps to begin praying with and through the scriptures.

- 1. Find a quiet place to sit and relax.
- 2. Take a deep breath and hold it for a few seconds and then release.
- 3. Pray a prayer to the Holy Spirit for guidance (something like the following):
- 4. "Come, Holy Spirit, fill my heart with Your holy gifts. Open my heart to hear Your voice and to respond."
- 5. Then say "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening."
- 6. Select a passage from one of the Gospels in which Jesus is interacting with others.
- 7. Recall what you are doing in engaging with the Word of God and what you desire from this encounter. God is present and because God is present, you need only rely on God.
- 8. Read the Gospel passage twice so that the story and details of the story become familiar to you.
- 9. Close your eyes and reconstruct the scene in your imagination. See what is going on and watch the men and women in the scene. What does Jesus look like? How do the others react to Him? What are the people saying to one another? What emotions fill their words? Is Jesus touching someone? As you enter into the scene, sometimes there is the desire to be there. So, you can place yourself in the scene, perhaps as an observer, or as one lining up for healing, or as one helping others to approach Jesus.
- 10. Some people's imaginations are very active and so they construct a movie-like scenario with a Gospel passage. Others will enter the scene with verbal imagination, reflecting on the scene and mulling over the actions. Vividness is not a criteria for this kind of prayer to be effective, but engagement is necessary to gain a more interior knowledge of Jesus.
- 11. As you finish this time of prayer, you should take a moment to speak person to person with Christ, saying what comes from the heart.

From our Pastoral Associate

Sr. Lori Fleming, SNDdeN

I read a eulogy that used the card game "Fish" as a metaphor for how to live a life developing relationships rooted in the principles of cooperation and interdependence. Living a model of Christ-centered community based on the Christian values of unity and justice demands that we ask for what we need. Simply put, this 'asking' is prayer.

"Fish" or "Go Fish" is an easy game for all God's children old enough to play—maybe ages two and up ('and up' implying a lifetime of learning; we are all God's little ones). Take the cards you receive, look at your "hand" to see what you have and what you are missing—that is what you need, and ask for it. It is really an easy game!

Fish is a "both-and" game. When we play this game, we learn not only to ask for what we need, but we practice the Gospel response—if you have what another player needs, and the other player asks for it, you give it to them. Perhaps some of us have had the experience of teaching others how to play Fish and we anticipated their need with the purpose of modeling how to play with good spirit. Wanting the common good—anticipating another's need.

Growing up as children of our Good God we discover what makes us happy or miserable, confident or fearful, troubled or at peace. This insight into what we need, and our ability to ask for help from others we meet on our journey through this life to eternal life, enables us to ask on behalf of others and to give a hand when we see that we have what another needs.

During these summer months, when we take time to play games together, may we pray for one another. Pray that we take quiet time to look at what we have, to see what we are missing, and to turn to our loving God in prayer to ask for what we need, knowing God always gives us what we need. And, of course, take time to ask—to pray—on behalf of others. Anticipate their needs.

In the World or in the Spirit?

We often hear today people say, "I'm not religious but I'm spiritual." I suppose that "I'm not religious" means I do not belong to any organized religion. And I suppose that "I'm spiritual" means I believe in God, I pray often, and I live to high moral standards. But, after interviewing many of these people, I find they do not know what it means to be spiritual.

The real dichotomy is "to be in the world or to be in the Spirit." Saint John in his first letter says, "Stop loving this evil world and all that it offers you, for when you love these things you show that you do not really love God. For all worldly things: evil desires, the craze for sex, the ambition to buy everything that appeals to you, and the pride that comes from wealth and importance, are not from God. They are from the evil world itself. And this world is fading away, and these evil, forbidden things will go with it, but whoever keeps doing the will of God will live forever."

Again, John writes, "Dear children, don't let anyone deceive you about this. If you are constantly doing what is good, it is because you are good, even as God is. But if you keep on sinning, it shows that you belong to Satan, who since he first began to sin has kept steadily at it. So now we can tell who is a child of God and who belongs to Satan. Whoever is living a life of sin and doesn't love his brother shows that he is not in God's family, for the message to us from the beginning has been that we should love one another."




