What is CLOW?

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) is an opportunity for the children of our collaborative—Preschool through Grade 5—to partake in the Liturgy of the Word in a manner that appeals to their age level. At the beginning of Mass they are led to the parish hall, where they will celebrate the Liturgy of the Word including: First Reading, Psalm, Second Reading, Alleluia, Gospel, and Prayer of the Faithful. They then return to the church at the Preparation of the Gifts to join their family in the celebration of the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Volunteer Opportunities

- 1. Ideally, we need a coordinator for each parish or someone willing to coordinate all three parishes.
- 2. Teams of 2-6 Adults/Confirmed Teens who can rotate serving as Leaders. A Team of 4-6 Adults who can rotate leading the Liturgy of the Word.
- 3. Two CLOW Leaders needed per Mass

Commitment involves reading over the prepared Lesson and Mass time only. Volunteers receive training and must attend *Protecting God's Children Workshop*. Confirmed teens are welcome to teach with one adult present.

4. Adult Shepherd

Not ready to be a CLOW leader but still want to get involved? Adult shepherds assist the children during the Liturgy and help them get to and from Mass. Volunteers must attend *Protecting God's Children Workshop*.

5. **Teen Shepherd** Teen shepherds assist the children during the liturgy. Volunteers should be in sixth grade or above.

Time Commitment

Mass time and lesson review (less than one hour) approximately once a month.

SPECIAL COLLECTION TO SUPPORT MAUI: SEPTEMBER 9TH/10TH

The images and news reports coming out of the Island of Maui are heartbreaking. The wildfires have killed more than 100 people, left many injured and missing, and destroyed homes and businesses.

Recognizing the immediate and growing need for assistance, Cardinal Seán has asked that a special collection be taken in all parishes in the Archdiocese of Boston to support Church relief efforts in the Diocese of Honolulu. Funds raised will support the Hawaii Catholic Community Foundation (HCCF) relief efforts for local community members affected by the Maui wildfires. We will be holding this collection on the weekend of September 9th/10th.

Last week, as we contemplated Mary's role in helping us follow Christ, we finished off our discussion by recognizing that a life of true praise and thanksgiving will lead us to living a life centered in unconditional love.

It is this unconditional love that empowers us to be true servants. Mary remained with Elizabeth for about three months and then returned to her home. Mary was modeling for us the way that Christ would eventually share his life with us. Jesus would teach us by his actions that He came not to be served, but to serve. In fact, He told us that He was modeling the behavior He expected from us, and Mary had already embraced that way of life. We must be people always ready to serve and not be served. That is the life Mary lived and the life Christ lived.

That life of service helps us, in a sense, to give "birth" to Jesus. There is a huge difference between simple service and Christian service. Service is simply about helping others in need, but Christian service is about recognizing the presence of God in the other. Each human being is made in the image and likeness of God, and each one of us was created for a specific purpose. Once a person discovers who they truly are, they can express the divine more fully in their life. Through our service to others, we help to make Christ seen in the world. We serve the other not simply by meeting their needs, but by helping them discover that they are specifically made in the image of God. We help them to hear Christ in their life and help them give birth to a faith—or a deepening of faith—in Christ.

Mary encountered God acting in her life in ways that may well have confused her, such as: the coming of the shepherds, the coming of the Magi, and finding Jesus in the temple. Mary pondered these events in her heart even though she did not understand what it all meant. But Mary did recognize God's hand in her life and desired to understand what was happening. We must become more like Mary and live a life that recognizes when God is acting in our life. In the process of experiencing God and seeking the meaning of his actions, we grow in faith and understanding. It is in this process that we can begin to discern God's plan for us.

Fast-forward to Mary at the wedding feast at Cana. When she asked Jesus to fix the problem with the wine, her advice to the servants speaks to our lives. She simply said in perfect trust, "Do whatever He tells you." There is probably no better advice in all of the New Testament. It is simple and direct—it is the life of obedience. When we begin to understand that God has a plan for our lives, we will come to know that our lives are not our own to do with as we please. Rather, our life is one of discernment that leads to following God's

plan for us. It calls for us to live a life of obedience to God's will. As it is written of Jesus, "He obediently accepted death, even death on a cross." Christ said that, to be his disciple, it is necessary to take up the cross as He took up his. We can only take up the cross when we are willing to live a life of obedience.

And Mary demonstrates to us exactly what that means. When she brought Jesus to the temple, she was told by Simeon that a sword would pierce her heart. I have no doubt that Mary did not understand these words. Their full meaning became clear as she stood at the foot of the cross watching her child die. I believe there is no greater pain possible than the loss of a child. And Mary had to endure watching her son be brutally murdered. In that moment a sword truly did pierce her heart, but Mary did not lose faith. Rather, she united herself with her son and took up the cross with some sense of hope. At some level I believe she trusted in Christ's promise that He would rise from the dead. But at the same time it did not lessen the pain she experienced. We, like Mary, are called to unite ourselves with Christ and take up our cross.

In all that she did, Mary sought to live her life centered in Christ. It was about understanding her role in salvation and living out God's plan as well as she could. It was about discerning the person God created her to be in order to serve Him and therefore truly live out her salvation. We cannot earn, merit, or deserve salvation. It will always be a free gift of God, offered to us through the death and resurrection of Christ. And Christ remains the only means of salvation for all of humanity, as He taught us, "I am the way, the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father except through me." Our part in salvation is simply to live out the great gift Christ has given us, and the best way to do that is to imitate Mary.

Mary lived a life of grace, humility, faith and trust. Her life was one of praise and thanksgiving, service to others, making Christ present, and being open to the presence of God. She contemplated God working in her life, she was obedient, she willingly took up the cross, and so forth. Only when we willingly strive to model our lives after Mary's can we truly open our hearts to God and embrace the salvation He offers us. God wants to save all of humanity but not all of humanity will accept his gift. The best way to discern how well we have chosen to live is to measure our lives against Mary's. Do we mirror her life or not? How we answer that question will tell us what we need to do.

God's Very Essence - Love

During a recent study on 'The Mystery of God' from Word on Fire Ministries, my awe grew and grew at the essence of God: *Ipsum Esse* – Being Itself. There is no cause or contingency that brought God into being; he always was and always will be.

"God is love; not just loving but love itself. Love only exists in relation to someone or something else. God is the eternal perfection of love within the communion of persons called the Holy Trinity."

In normal day-to-day living, one doesn't often stop to take the time to think about the full mystery of God. Father, Son and Holy Spirit; one God, three persons: *Ipsum Esse* – Being Itself.

God is love. Love is willing the good of the other. When we surrender to *Ipsum Esse*—to God—we become fully alive.

God created the universe out of love, to love his creation. To share his love with you and me. For us to share his love with others.

At The Holy Rood Collaborative, all staff members, full or part-time, are called to a mission: to bring others into a relationship, or a deeper relationship, with Jesus. This is actually the mission of every Baptized Christian. I hope that this isn't a surprise to you!

"As we Catholic Christians live out our responsibility to spread the Gospel, it is very important to remember that effecting true conversion is the work of the Holy Spirit."

"We as believers are called to aid in the work of the Spirit during our daily conversations with friends and family; however, this aid must be firmly grounded in a close relationship with God."

This study was transforming for me. Bishop Robert Barron cautions us not to domesticate the cross and he paints a vivid image of God sending his Son into humanity to transform it with his presence. Sending his Son all the way down into the abyss, in solidarity with the dead, in order to raise us up. How can we not be willing to share God's love with each other? How can we keep this divine love to ourselves?

The Unexamined Life is not Worth Living

This statement, "The unexamined life is not worth living," is famously ascribed to Socrates, the great philosopher. Through this statement, Socrates affirms that any human person who does not examine his or her life regularly would, over time, be deprived of the meaning and purpose of existence. This is also an important exercise in the spiritual life. In this direction, spiritual masters recommend that people interested in growing to spiritual maturity should engage in daily self-examination and meditation. These spiritual exercises help people in spiritual growth to explore areas in their lives that need to be better. Thus, they are able to make resolutions that will aid their striving for holiness of life.

Jesus, in the gospel (Matthew 16:13-20), asked his disciples "Who do people say that I am?" And they answered, "John the Baptist; but others say Elijah. And others say one of the prophets who has risen." It was Peter who answered correctly: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Then, Jesus blessed him and acknowledged that it was the Holy Spirit that revealed it to him. In this text, we see entered into Iesus the journey self-introspection from the angle of what the people are saying. This is a paradigm that Jesus shows us so that we too can engage in daily self-examination as a way for growth and maturing in the way of God and holiness. When we practice self-examination and get to know who people say that we are, and we are able to discover the various mirrors about ourselves that affirm, deepen and reflect our self-image, knowledge, beliefs, values and assumptions. This does not mean that what people say about us is always correct, but it will give us the opportunity to discover things that we otherwise might not have known.

Peter, through the Holy Spirit, reveals the true identity of Jesus: Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God. With this, we see that there is a part of us that only God knows, and this reflects our true identity as God's children. The Holy Spirit used Peter today to reveal to us who Jesus is-the anointed one, the Son of the living God. God also wants to continue to use us in revealing Christ to others. When we continue practice self-examination of our lives, we are able to better reflect Christ to others through our personal witnessing. May God continue to bless us and grant us the grace we need as we journey through personal spiritual growth and holiness.







