I'm 45 years old. In February, for the first time in my life, I experienced the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist—a moment of awe so intense and powerful, it left me almost fearful until I found comfort in Scripture.

This experience left me with a new devotion to the Eucharist and a wish that everyone could experience what I did. I believe God's timing in revealing himself to me was no accident: a national Eucharistic Revival movement was launched on Corpus Christi of this same year. Wanting to honor my devotion to the Body and Blood of Christ on its feast day, and with support from Fr. Brian and Fr. Fernando, I planned a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration.

I had no idea what to expect. That particular Sunday turned out to feature perfect weather after a week of rain, and I was nervous no one would come. But you were there. We sang. We prayed together. We spent time in the Presence of Christ. Many of you asked Fr. Fernando and me if we could hold these regularly, and after some discussion, we are happy to announce...

MONTHLY HOLY HOUR

In addition to our current Eucharistic Adoration schedule, beginning next Sunday, September 17th, we'll begin a monthly devotion of Eucharistic Adoration. Every third Sunday from now through June 2024, we will gather at St. Mary Church at 3:30 pm. We will sing. We will pray together. We will adore our Lord in the Eucharist. Some of you told me you wished we'd left more time for silent prayer, so we'll make sure to leave space.

Come and spend an hour celebrating God's gift of the Eucharist to us. Bring with you anything that will bring you closer to God: family, friends, a Bible, your Rosary beads, or just yourself. I hope you'll join us!

Deacon John Hunt's homily last weekend was quite good, and it really got me thinking. He compared last Sunday's Gospel to the previous Sunday's Gospel, concerning Peter's reaction to Jesus. Just as a reminder of the

two salient differences: When Jesus asks his disciples directly, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter responds, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus tells Peter that he is the rock on which the faith will be built. Right after this encounter Jesus speaks about his Passion. He makes clear what will happen to Him—that he will be crucified and then raised from the dead. Peter immediately takes Jesus aside and rebukes Him saying, "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you." Jesus turns and says to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking *not* as God does, but as human beings do."

As I pondered Deacon John's homily, it made me think about the word 'Christ', or Messiah, which is what Christ means. As I thought more about the two interactions, it struck me that at the heart of the issue Peter did not really appreciate fully what he was saying. Peter's response to the Transfiguration was, "Lord, it is good that we are here." We are told that he did not really know what he was saying. Peter's initial response to Jesus' question "Who do you say that I am?" was correct. However, Jesus tells us that Peter's response did not simply come from him, but that his words were divinely inspired. The problem with Peter's response, I think, is twofold.

First, Peter did not really understand what was prophesied about the Christ/Messiah. He had his own ideas about what he was saying. Most likely he expected something very different for Jesus. Most likely he thought that some action of worldly power would demonstrate Jesus' authority and importance. This can be recognized in the scene of James and John asking to sit at Jesus' right and left when He comes into his Kingdom. The other apostles got quite upset, I believe, because they didn't think of it first. They all saw Jesus as a means of their getting ahead in the world. They were thinking as human beings do, not as God does. The focus of the apostles was on what would happen to them in this world and how Jesus would fit into that picture.

When we see Jesus in this way, we are focusing on the wrong reality. Our focus should be on eternity—or heaven. Now that does not mean this life is not important, but that it finds its meaning only in how it leads us to embracing eternal life. Otherwise, we can become an obstacle to both growing in our faith and leading others to Christ. When the world becomes our focus, then how Christ fits into our life becomes about how He can help us reach our goals.

The purpose of Christ's mission is no longer centered on salvation, but is about helping us feel good about ourselves. It is about boosting our self-image. It is about changing Christ to fit our way of looking at the world. And that is when Jesus tells us, "Get behind me, Satan." (The word Satan means adversary.) We essentially no longer act as a follower of Christ but as his adversary. We are working against what Christ is trying to accomplish.

How this all happens arises out of the second problem in Peter's response. He did not really listen to what he actually said. Jesus made it clear that Peter's response did not come from him but that it was divinely inspired. Peter did not stop and ask himself, "What is God is trying to tell me?" Rather, he simply assumed he understood Jesus and took on face value that God would see things his way. Thus, he became an obstacle, an adversary of God. When we do not take time to sit and listen to the Lord, we are going to get things wrong and that can cause catastrophic events in our life. Most likely we are going to start moving away from Christ. And since He is the only way to salvation, that should tell us that we are heading in the wrong direction.

Over time Peter will come to give his life completely over to Christ. He will suffer martyrdom by being crucified in Rome. The great thing about Peter's story is that it gives us hope. His following of Jesus was not a straight and even path. He falls down a lot and moves in the wrong direction from time to time. But Jesus is patient with him and gives him the grace necessary to ultimately stay the course.

Peter eventually begins to think *not* as human beings do, but as God does. His deepest desire becomes about following Christ and leading others to Christ. Once that becomes his focus, he understands who Christ really is. He no longer fears taking up his cross and following Christ. His focus is not about deserving salvation but, simply, living out what Christ has won for him.

It is so easy to lose our proper focus. It is so easy to seek a different Christ, but that is the way of damnation. That is when we become an obstacle and adversary of Christ. But as Peter teaches us, even then it does not need to be the final reality. Our God is loving, merciful, and compassionate and, of course, patient. When we lose our focus, He will seek us out to draw us back. He did that with Peter and He can do it with us.

Next Sunday we will be celebrating the Confirmation of ~30 of our young people. It is important that we, as a community, support these young people with our prayers. There is of course, no right way to pray for these young men and women but in case you are at a loss for how to do so, allow me to share one way that I pray from them.

I have a Confirmation playlist, filled with songs about the Holy Spirit, that I will listen to in the weeks leading up to Confirmation. As I listen, I try to reflect on how the lyrics might apply to the Confirmandi and turn them into petitions on their behalf to our Lord. To give an idea of this, I offer the below prayer, using a hymn that is particularly apt for Confirmation. I invite you to pray it along with me.

Come Holy Ghost, Creator Blest, And in our hearts take up They rest; Come with Thy Grace and heav'nly aid, To fill the hearts which Thou hast made. To fill the hearts which Thou hast made.

Dear Lord, you have made each and every one of these young people; they are unique, unrepeatable creations through which you intend to bless the world. In Baptism, You were invited into their hearts for the first time, so they might live their lives knowing, loving, and following You. Please allow their hearts to be open to you once more at Confirmation. Fill them with Your love and goodness.

O Comfort Blest to Thee we cry, Thou heav'nly Gift of God most high; Thou fount of life and fire of love, And sweet anointing from above, And sweet anointing from above.

Dear Lord, soon these young people will be anointed with sacred chrism. Please set them ablaze with love for You. Help them to recognize the git that is Your presence in their lives and make them yearn to share that gift with others.

Praise be to Thee Father and Son, And Holy Spirit Three in one; And may the Son on us bestow The gifts that from the Spirit flow, The gifts that front the Spirit flow.

Dear Lord, these young people have learned about the 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit, given in Baptism and strengthened in Confirmation. Help them to embrace these gifts of Wisdom, Knowledge, Understanding, Good Counsel, Fortitude, Fear of the Lord, and Piety. Allow them to use these gifts to pursue their own salvation and the salvation of others. Amen.

From our Parochial Vicar

A Christian Way to Correct Others

Christian love demands from us that we help our brothers and sisters do what is right. We owe correction to them. This includes even those who have sinned against us. Yet, many times correcting someone leads to arguments and fights, especially within our own families and friends. So, many of us may try to avoid the whole situation by offering no correction at all. However, we owe our brothers and sisters fraternal correction out of love for them. In the Gospel of Matthew (18:15-20), Christ gives us a general guideline for doing so:

- First, we correct them in private or in secret—just between the two of you.
 If he or she listens, we may have saved them.
- Second, if they do not listen after multiple attempts to correct them privately, we seek the help of one or two of their good friends or relatives.
 We do so to help them do what is right.
- Third, if they still refuse to listen, we tell more people so that the community may be able to help them. Keep in mind that we only tell those who can help them. We do not tell others just for the sake of telling others.
- Fourth, if they still refuse to listen, even after trying to correct them with the help of their own community, we leave it be. It is now time to just pray for them. It is now in God's hands.

Sometimes we act opposite to what Christ has revealed to us. We start by telling someone's faults to everyone first, and the person who is at fault is the last to know. Other times, we may overdo it. We may feel the need to go on correcting everyone when we ought not to. Fraternal correction can only happen where there already exists a common unity or a place of trust. It can only happen with someone who is a 'frater' (i.e., brother, sister, friend). Fraternal correction is like pruning: if we overdo it, we may end up killing the plant—or the bond that already exists.

We wanted to reach out and give you an update on the Ukrainian family which you have so generously supported with kind words, many prayers, and selfless donations. They have been in the US now for 2 months. During this time, we worked hard on our goal of organizing their paperwork and affairs in the US system of bureaucracy. Things have been moving forward, but as I'm sure you know, progress is gradual. We also spent time helping them to become familiar with their surroundings and resources—in Billerica, Lowell, and Boston. We would like to say thank you to these special people who helped in significant and sacrificial ways:

Perhaps the children of such a person don't feel ready to sell the house, but the house can be used to help the Ukrainian family in the meantime. Another idea is someone who has a vacant in-law apartment or secondary housing unit on their property. 
Lamps


