

with an IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) before December 31, 2023

People who are 72 or older and have traditional IRAs may use them to make charitable gifts in 2023. Both convenient and tax-advantaged, a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) from an IRA allows a donor to direct pre-tax assets to charitable organizations, like St. Mary's, St. John's or St. Margaret's, without incurring any tax. The QCD is not recognized as income, so donors receive a tax benefit and could possibly decrease the amount of your taxable social security benefits. Gifts of any amount, up to a maximum of \$100,000 per IRA plan owner per calendar year, may be made this way.

As we need to keep the finances separate, when making a gift, please be sure to indicate to which parish—St. Mary, St. Margaret of Scotland or St. John the Evangelist—you would like your gift processed.

Your generosity will help our parishes to continue building the programs and ministries for the present and future growth of our faith communities. Please feel free to contact your financial advisor for additional information about using your IRA to make a gift to your parish.

People have told me that I am a pretty optimistic person, and I know that to be true. I believe that no matter what the situation, there is always something positive to be found. When I had my recent motorcycle

accident, I did not look at what was wrong—the loss of the motorcycle or my broken leg. Rather, I gave praise to God, even in the midst of all that was happening, for simply being with me. He gave me strength to persevere and to recognize the good that was in my life. I was able to give praise and thanksgiving to God for no other reason than his being God.

We are a people truly blessed because we have faith in Jesus Christ. There is so much that is going wrong in the world, and quite frankly that has always been true, but with the eyes of faith we can see beyond the world as it is. In faith we have the faculty, if we use it, to see the world as it can be—as God intends it to be.

This weekend we light the pink candle on the Advent wreath as a reminder that Christmas is coming soon. It reminds us *not* simply of the past coming of Christ but also that He is coming again. It gives us hope to rejoice. Think of a sunrise. The colors of the sky start off somewhat dark and then slowly turn to purple, and as the sun comes closer to rising the purples give way to pink, and eventually the sun rises and gives us light. Jesus is the Light! But why do we believe that Jesus came or that He is coming again? Simply put, we believe this with the eyes of faith: we see the world as it is but know that Jesus is still with us.

The Holy Spirit dwells in all baptized Christians, and so they are temples of the Lord. The power of the Spirit makes Christ present within us. That is why at the start of Mass we greet each other with: "The Lord be with you." "And with your spirit." The Christ in the priest is greeting the Christ in all who are gathered at the celebration. We hear Christ again as He uses others at Mass to proclaim his word. Christ is present in each of his sacraments but most powerfully in the Eucharist which is Christ himself. Christ promised never to leave or abandon us and we have come to rejoice in his "hidden" presence. It is that presence that helps us know that Jesus is with us-He, who was born, lived, preached, was crucified, died, rose from the dead and ascended into heaven, is with

us. And we await with hope and joyful expectation for that same Christ to come again.

We do not need to live as a people of fear. Instead, we recognize that we are simply waiting for the sunrise to complete. And while we wait, our God is with us. Jesus walks with us. And we show that hope by being a people who live a life of rejoicing. As the scriptures tell us, "Rejoicing in the Lord must be your strength." It is easy to lose focus. It is easy to allow the brokenness of the world to become our focus. When that happens, then it is hard to see the potential of the world. It is hard to find a reason to hope. It is hard to rejoice. We are like Peter walking on the water. As long as he stayed focused on Christ, he could walk on the water. But as soon as his focus became the storm and the waves, he lost true perspective and began to drown. He then turned to Christ who was with him the whole time and cried out for help. Jesus then lifted him up. As Christians we must remember that no matter how big the storm or how large the waves, Christ will always be there to lift us up.

As we await the coming of Christ with hope and rejoicing, we do it *not* as a people abandoned by Jesus until He returns. Rather, we are a people who trust in God's promises. "Can a mother forget her infant, be without tenderness for the child of her womb? Even should she forget, I will never forget you." Jesus will never forget us. He will never forsake us. He will always be with us. We are a people who await the rising sun with faith that it will come as promised. Advent is a simple reminder of our faith, of our hope, and why we rejoice.

People may ask us why we are a people of joy and hope, and we should have a ready answer. As Saint Peter wrote to us, "Simply reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that is in you." (1 Pet. 3:15). The reason for our hope is simple. It is Jesus.

From our Permanent Deacon Don Fronk Perez de Alderete

This is the third week of Advent, but I'm not writing this article in the third week, I'm actually writing it several weeks before. Back in June, I found out my son and his wife were expecting. At that time, the baby was a hazy picture on an ultrasound, a tiny new member of the family. The due date was around Thanksgiving, which is when I'm writing this. We've gone from a hazy image to a very obvious pregnancy, complete with episodes of samba dance and slow rolls.

This Advent has been both spiritual and very physical for us as we prepare for a baby. As the due date approaches, I look around my house and realize that it is about as baby-ready as a lion's den. The outlets on the wall I painted a few weeks ago still don't have outlet covers, much less plugs to go into unused outlets. The tools I used during the paint project are still at the top of the stairs to take into the workshop. Then there's the dust from a patch project in another room, along with another little stack of tools. And those are just the home repair issues. The rest of the house isn't configured for babies. The staircase doesn't have a gate, or netting, and then there's the pellet stove just standing there in the corner. And absolutely *nothing* is child-proofed. In short, a threeminute walk around the house produced enough tasks on the to-do list that I should be done sometime around the kid's graduation.

I know the baby won't be crawling or toddling for a while, but there's a sense of urgency to get my house in order. I know I don't need to be as prepared as the baby's parents, but I want to welcome that child in the best possible way. It's impossible for me **not** to see the parallels with Advent. What are the chores I started but never quite finished? What are the things in my life that keep me from welcoming the Baby Jesus?

Advent reminds us that just planning to do things isn't enough; we have to get to doing the work. We have to put away the things that interfere with our relationship with the Savior, and it starts with the little things we've been putting off or ignoring. Advent reminds us to prepare to welcome Jesus into our lives, not eventually, but soon and very soon.

The Third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday, or Joyful Sunday. I get that really well, the time is coming, and it's getting nearer; the excitement is palpable. We call it out as a special day to take in the joy that is about to come. Time to take stock of what we have accomplished in our preparations so far and lean into the changes we anticipate. We may not be able to get to all of our challenges, or complete them in time for Christmas, but by recognizing and prioritizing them we move forward in being ready to receive our Lord.


