An Easter Message

May the Lord give you His peace!

Easter has come! We proclaim once again with greater joy and gratitude after a very difficult and challenging vear, "the Lord is Risen!" This is what it is all about. This is where our Lord as the Good Shepherd is leading each one of us. All things culminate in Easter. The crosses of our Good Fridays stretch our hearts to the breaking point so that they will be able to receive and contain the Easter joy our Lord wants to pour into them. Considering the wounds so many of us have suffered this past year, perhaps this explains why our celebration of Jesus' resurrection is so much meaningful and our joy so much greater this year. Yet, I wonder if we are like the women who were at the tomb on that Easter Sunday morning. Perhaps the words the angels spoke to them are also meant for us, namely, "Do not be afraid..." (Matthew 28:5). What are we afraid of? Is it possible that we are afraid to be happy? Does that make sense? Are we seeking the crucified one or the risen one? Are we expecting Good Friday or Easter? Maybe we are skeptical of letting the light of Easter into our hearts. Maybe we are waiting for the other shoe to drop as the expression goes. Are we reliving the fearful events of this past year's Good Fridays in our memories? Are we allowing our hearts to be entombed by the fear of the future and our imaginings of what could happen?

Don't be afraid to be *happy*. Believing that He is risen is not just about believing in an event that happened over 2,000 years ago or something that only concerns what happens to us when we die. Jesus invites us to enter into the joy of His resurrection, *right now*. He is alive *right now*. Our experience of the joy of Easter today is a foretaste of the *eternal* Easter to come. Let us taste the goodness of the Lord *today*, so that we will always remember what life is really all about and savor the joy of knowing the One *who is the Life of the world and the cause of our Joy today and for all eternity*.

With regard to entering into Easter joy, I am grateful to everyone who has been a part of helping us celebrate these special days of Holy Week and Easter. We have much to be thankful for and much to rejoice in. We have a great team here at St. Anthony's! May God bless each of you, your families, and all of us here at St. Anthony's. May God work through each of us to bring His joy into the world, so all may know that He is risen. Have a wonderful Easter and know that you are kept in my prayers.

"You know what happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all he did both in the country of the Jews and all Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead."

This sermon of Peter, one of many in the Acts of the Apostles, summarizes well the reason for our belief today. His words sum up the mission of Jesus as part of the plan of God. He went about doing good and healing all.

The work of Jesus continues today in His church. The presence of the Risen Christ summons us to continue His work. Rather than criticize and complain, consider whether I am a true witness of Christ for others and ask how can I bring the message of His presence to others. Jesus lives and He lives in us today. Happy Easter.

First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Peter discusses Jesus' life of preaching and healing. Jesus was crucified, then he rose up and was seen by his chosen witnesses. Peter also mentions the importance of all the disciples bearing witness to what they saw, so that many people would believe in Jesus, and have their sins forgiven through him.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Paul asserts that we must pay attention to higher realms rather than earthly concerns. Our life is not yet completely known to us, until Christ appears and we are raised to glory in him.

Gospel: John 20:1-9

When Mary Magdalene discovered Jesus' tomb was open, she told Simon Peter and another disciple. They ran to the tomb and Peter went inside. He found the burial wrappings on the ground, with the head covering separate from the rest. The other disciple came in and they believed what they saw, although until then they had not understood the Scripture's message of Jesus' resurrection.
