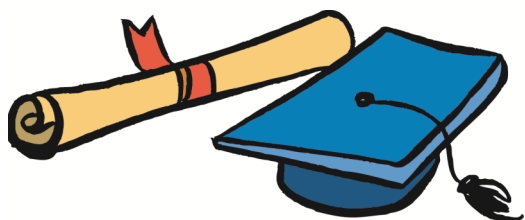

**Loving as New Creations** *"There's something different about you."*

Think about the times in your life when this has been said to you. Maybe it was  
after someone complimented you on a job well done, and you realized that you  
were walking through life with a little more confidence. Maybe it was after meeting  
someone special, as you carried the glow of that relationship wherever you went.  
Chances are, if someone has noticed something different about you, it's because,  
inwardly, you've been changed by the loving or respectful actions of another person.

Love, you see, can make us into new creations. From the love of God flows the grace  
to tackle any challenge, including the biggest challenge of all: loving each other well.  
Christ knows what a big request this is. He was human, too. He came and lived
