SUNDAY, MARCH 27, 2022 — 4TH SUNDAY OF LENT

The Story of the Prodigal Son, The Story of the Prodigal's Brother, The Story of the Compassionate Father; it all depends on which angle you wish to look at it.

We all love this story. It is probably the most famous of Jesus' parables. Fr. Henry Nouwen has written a book on this parable as he was living with the Larche' community. It is a great read.

The compassion of the Father is what strikes me. He waits and waits knowing the son will one day return. He is vigilant in his watching. He is constant in His love for his sons even though one misuses the Father's love in squandering what the Father offers him and the other does not know the Father's love thinking himself as a slave of the father's commands.

When the prodigal returns, he has rehearsed what he is going to say to the Father to reconcile himself to the Father. In watching what happens in the exchange we can learn much about God's love for us.

On meeting there is an embrace. The son is given time to say what needs to be said. "I am sorry". On hearing the confession, the Father lavishes his bounty upon the lost son. The best robe, a restored ring, probably a good bath, all to make the son feel he is welcomed home and reconciled.

Note that the Father allows the son to confess before lavishing him with a renewed inheritance. God the Father gives us time also to confess. Without it we can come to a conclusion that the Father has no honor for himself. The Father actually honors the son in letting him have his say.

We can learn a great lesson from this very short dialogue in how to honor those whom we have sinned against and those who have sinned against us.

The words 'I forgive you' are powerful words. They never communicate 'all is as if nothing has happened'. They communicate, 'What you have done hurt deeply', and they communicate 'I set you free'. We ourselves are never free until we give freedom to those whom we need to forgive.



Synod News



Development and Peace

Standing up to corporate power in Honduras

The *People and Planet First* campaign is about helping communities stand up to

corporate power. In Honduras, as in much of the Global South, corporations often threaten and criminalize activists who speak up against their abuses. The Lenca Indigenous leader Víctor Vásquez was imprisoned for fighting the corporate takeover of his people's ancestral territory. Development and Peace's partner, the Honduran Centre for the Proof Community Development (CEHPRODEC), helped free him from jail. Another partner, Caritas Choluteca, trains and accompanies community leaders in advocating for policies that respect human rights and the environment. Recently, they got mayoral election candidates to undertake to declare the municipality of Orocuina a mining-free zone if elected.
