Update from the Finance Council:

The Finance Council met in January to review the interim financial results for the 2021 calendar year. (Final results are being calculated.) 2021 was a challenging year, as the parish ran a deficit of \$17,210.

In terms of revenues, collections from masses were below 2020 level, while our PAC and credit card donations remained very close to 2020 levels. The introduction of the Canada Helps online donation option, as well as the funds received from the Government of Canada through the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy were very important for the parish this past year. The wage subsidy has expired, but in total, the parish received over \$37,000 in funding through this measure. Overall, revenues were roughly \$30,000 lower in 2021 than in 2020.

Operating expenditures were also lower in 2021 – \$25,000 below 2020 levels. Expenditures were lower across all categories – administration, utilities and maintenance, Diocesan Tax, and interest and bank charges. The replacement of the carpets in the rectory with hardwood was the only major extraordinary expense in 2021. As we have reported before, we are still watching the heating unit for the social space and main entrance, but as long as this continues to work, we will continue with it.

In terms of the overall financial position of the parish, our mortgage balance has declined to \$259,168, and will be paid off completely at the end of 2024. The parish continues to hold just under \$36,000 in deposits with the Diocese. These deposits continue to grow as the Diocese pays 3.5% interest on the funds.

The year end financial report will be posted on the parish web site in March. The Diocese requires that the parish prepare a balanced budget at the start of every year. This will be complicated by the ongoing pandemic and its impact on masses – particularly Easter and Christmas.

The Prayer of the Synod: Adsumus Sancte Spiritus

This prayer can be widely used throughout the diocesan phase of the Synodal Process. Attributed to St. Isidore of Seville (560-636), it has been traditionally used at Councils and Synods for hundreds of years. The version below was specifically designed for the Church's Synodal journey from 2021 to 2023.

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name.

With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts;

Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it.

We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder.

Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions.

Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life

and not stray from the way of truth and what is right.

All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time,

in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.
