Simply provide us with the name on the order and we'll take care of the rest, regardless of whether you pick up or dine in. For every prepaid adult ticket bought, one free child's ticket will be provided.

Dinner consists of fried catfish, french fries, coleslaw, hush puppies and a beverage (tea or lemonade). There is also a cheese pizza roll option. Each adult dinner costs \$15, while child plates are \$10. All proceeds raised are used to support our Life Teen program.

#### **PRFPARE**

- · Begin with the sign of the cross.
- Take a moment to be quiet and still.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you in this prayer time.

#### READ

- Read a Scripture selection slowly and attentively.
- · Note any word, phrase, or image that catches your attention.
- Consider reading more than once, and/or out loud.

#### REFLECT

- Think about the meaning of whatever caught your attention.
- Possibly imagine yourself in the scene.
- What is the Lord saying to you through this text?
- Are there any: promises to claim, commands to obey, examples to follow, errors to avoid, praises to sing...

### RESPOND

- Talk to God about the passage or anything else on your heart.
- Thank him for blessings received; Ask him for what you & others need.
- Note any changes or actions you are drawn to live out.

#### **REST**

- Spend a few minutes in restful silence with him.
- "Be still and know that I am God." (Ps 46:11)

The ashes we receive are not so much a sign of our sinfulness, but a reminder that we weren't made for this world.

#### A Day of Fasting and Abstinence

While not a Holy Day of Obligation, Ash Wednesday is a day of abstinence (not eating meat) and fasting (eating only one full meal and two small meals). Fasting, especially as we begin our Lenten journey, is an opportunity to exercise detachment from the things of this passing world. Just as a mother insists her children put their phones down in order to be present to the family at the dinner table, the Church has made this day of fasting obligatory for anyone from 18 to 59 years old. The mentally, physically and chronically ill, as well as pregnant or nursing women are excused from fasting and abstinence.

# Healing Prayer


