



Laudato Si' Animators Program for Creation Care

April 19th is the start of the Laudato Si' Animators course; a free six-week online learning and certification program offered by the Laudato Si' Movement. The program aims to bring the encyclical, Laudato Si', to life in each individual and serve as an introduction to how the global Catholic Church is engaging in creation care and the cry of the poor.
