

A Message from Bishop Vásquez May 20, 2023

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Christ is risen! Alleluia!

As chief shepherd of the Diocese of Austin, celebrating a priestly ordination is one of the most joyous occasions of the year for me. Ordinarily, we would celebrate a priestly ordination in the month of June; however, this year, for the first time in nearly twenty years, we will not.

This sad news reminds me of the time when Jesus is moved with pity "[a]t the sight of the crowds ... because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd." Jesus then commands his disciples, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest," (Matthew 9:36-38).

Following Christ's command to his disciples, we will turn to the "master of the harvest" by having a diocesan Holy Hour for Vocations on Saturday, June 10th. It is most appropriate that we gather on the eve of the Feast of Corpus Christi because, without the priest, there is no Eucharist. I ask you to join me on this day at 10 a.m. at St. Louis Catholic Church in Austin. We will begin with a spiritual conference given by a priest, followed by a Eucharistic holy hour to pray for more priestly vocations.

After the holy hour, a reception will follow honoring the priests who serve us. You can find more information about this event at austinvocations.com. I hope to see you there.

May God, by his grace and generosity, answer our prayers for more priests to serve the People of God in the Diocese of Austin.

Little Liturgy Lessons LEAVE-TAKING BY REV. DAVID TRAHAN

Isay "leave-taking" rather than "exiting" or just "leaving" because at the end of the Mass, we do not just wander away on our own, left as we were when we entered. The traditional formula, "Ita, missa est," currently translated as "Go forth, the Mass is ended," is not literally that in English. More literally, it says, "Go, she is sent!"

It is a command, not a suggestion or a simple "goodbye." We are ordered out, commanded to leave. She, the Church, is not just left to wander off on her own, but is commissioned as Christ commissioned the disciples at His Ascension, to go forth and reveal the Gospel. We leave the Mass not just because the time is complete, but because we have been given the Gift of the Lord and we must now take that Gift out into the world.

Each of the other three options for the dismissal at the end of the Mass, "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord," "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life," or simply "Go in peace" are each commands. We have been given the Gospel, literally nourished by the Word—entrusted with that great gift, we are expected to yield results with it. We have been given Peace Himself as our food to transform us into that same peace He shares. Thus none of these are simple well-wishing farewells but instructions on what to do next.

We do not cease to be Christians once we leave the doors of the parish church and we must take the fruits of what the Lord has shared with us.

Do I leave the Mass commissioned and invigorated to live out my Christian dignity in a greater way? Do I see the Lord as left behind in the church, or as One Who accompanies me as I go forth?

Called to be a Parent.

Yes, I guess you could say I was called to be a mom even before I was born. Though, at first, I thought God had other plans for me. I was engaged but didn't foresee a child in my future. So, my betrothed was very much surprised when he found out that we were going to have a baby boy. I, on the other hand, was simply in awe that God was asking me to be a mom. When I gave birth, it wasn't the most ideal of circumstances. I gave birth away from family. But it didn't matter to me, for a myriad of angels sang when my son was born. I couldn't for a moment take my eyes off my little one. The joy I felt then, I still feel every time I look at him.

It's true what they say: that parenthood is a calling—a vocation. There is no way I could survive the everyday challenges of being a mom if it weren't for the grace that God gives to every vocation. Once, I had the misfortune of losing my son in a crowd. And, to think, we were among relatives. I can't begin to tell you how fervent a parent's prayer can be for a lost child. My heart overflowed when we finally found him. I've realized that parenthood is like that—joy and sorrow, co-existing. I saw and heard my son being admired one minute, then ridiculed the next.

Whenever someone praised him, I would smile and think to myself, "If only you knew!" And when he was mocked and crucified ... I wanted to cradle him in my arms like I did many times before.

My son has always had a generous heart. He gave all he could give to this world. He even gave me. "Behold, your Mother!" (Jn 19:27)

Some thoughts for prayer and reflection ...

As May ends, a month typically dedicated to our Lady, are there Marian devotions you can teach/do with your little ones to celebrate Mary? How about praying the rosary with your family?

Have you considered that being a parent is a true vocation? Do you ask for the help of your child's guardian angel? Do you entrust your children to our Lady? Do you pray to God for each of your children, asking him to help you see the best way you can help each one grow in holiness?

Please accept our apologies for no visible action on our Stations of the Cross and font restoration projects. These are still active projects and work has been occurring behind the scenes. Here is the latest:

Stations of the Cross

A down payment has been issued to the metal fabricator who will construct new marquees for each station. Additionally, missing metal crosses are being fabricated. Plans are being finalized to bid on tree replacement to take place this fall as the ice storm losses took away much of the isolation from FM 620.

Font Restoration

The baptismal font contractors have been identified. This summer, the work will replace the dilapidated supporting steel structure, tub and masonry.

We are thankful for the donors who have helped fund these projects.




